**AP 5170 TRIO PROGRAMS**

The TRIO Program is a federal program funded by the U.S. Department of Education to helping students from low income families and first generation background to finish high school, enter college, and successfully graduate.

The District hosts the following TRIO Programs: Educational Opportunity Center, Student Support Services, and Upward Bound.

**TRIO/North County Educational Opportunity Center (NCEOC)**

NCEOC staff provides information and advising to qualified adults (low income and or first-generation college) who want to enter or continue attending:

- an adult school (GED program)
- a community college (including ESL, career/technical, certificate and degree programs)
- other educational institutions (after high school)

The program staff provides the following services:

- academic advisement
- career advisement
- financial aid information
- access to postsecondary tutoring
- test preparation
- workshops designed to support student success

**TRIO/Student Support Services**

TRIO/Student Support Services at Palomar College is designed to provide support services to potential transfer college students and enhance their chances for successful completion as they pursue their baccalaureate degree.

- 38 • college/university visits
- 39 • student success workshops
- 40 • financial aid information
- 41 • cultural events.

45 The Upward Bound (UB) Program is an outreach and retention program for eligible high  
46 school students who are motivated to attend and succeed in college. Services offered  
47 to student participants include:

- 48 • academic advising
- 49 • after-school tutoring
- 50 • college-admissions and financial-aid information
- 51 • study-skills and SAT workshops
- 52 • college-campus visits
- 53 • cultural and educational programs
- 54 • supplemental instruction in subjects such as English, math, science, and foreign  
55 language on UB College Saturdays
- 56 • summer residential program

58 In order to participate in the Upward Bound Program, students must meet the low-  
59 income and first-generation eligibility criteria and be ninth graders enrolled in the  
60 following high schools: Escondido High School, Orange Glen High School, San  
61 Pasqual High School, San Marcos High School, Oceanside High School, and El Camino  
62 High School.
