The scholarships offered in this newsletter are offered in cooperation with the Financial Aid and Scholarship Office and the Palomar College Foundation Office

AFRICAN AMERICAN

A \$150 scholarship for spring for an African American student, GPA 2.5, with at least 12 units at Palomar College. A mentor will be assigned from the African-American scholarship committee. Submit transcript(s), application, a reference letter, a one to two page essay, describe education, vocational goals, community involvement and indicate financial need. If not in good standing, or not enrolled in the recommended educational plan, may forfeit this scholarship. Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 24, 2000**.

ALANE ARDIS

A \$1000 award to a student majoring in chemistry, bio-chemistry, or chemical engineering. Student must be enrolled in or have completed the second semester of General Chemistry (Chem 2,4). A 3.0 GPA or better is required and the student must have demonstrated high achievement in chemistry courses at Palomar. Student must plan to transfer to a 4-year college in the fall of 2000 and submit fall schedule to the Financial Aid Office to obtain the scholarship. Submit transcript, application, name of 4-year college and autobiography. Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 22, 2000**.

RUTH BOMSER MEMORIAL

A \$400 scholarship to a returning student (\$200 for fall and \$200 for spring). Must be a *full-time reentry woman* in business or math. Indicate volunteer and community involvement. Required GPA 3.0. Submit application, transcript and autobiography to the Financial Aid Office by **March 20, 2000**.

DENNIS BOSTIC MEMORIAL

A \$300 scholarship for a student majoring in life sciences. Applicant may be **transferring or returning**. This is a memorial award to honor former Palomar College Instructor Dennis Bostic. Must be full-time at the time of application and in the fall 2000, when scholarship is awarded. Submit unofficial transcript, application and autobiography. Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 22, 2000**.

BILL BRADLEY

A \$200 scholarship for a **returning** student and a \$800 scholarship to a **transferring** student majoring in mathematics, engineering or any of the physical, earth or life sciences. Must be full-time at the time of application and in the fall 2000 when money is disbursed. GPA of 3.0 required. Application, unofficial transcript and autobiography due to the Financial Aid Office **March 22, 2000**.

BUSINESS EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

One or more \$300 scholarships to **returning or transferring** Business Education students will be awarded in 2000. Must be a Palomar College Business Education major, including the areas of Accounting, Advertising, Marketing, and Merchandising; Bookkeeping/Accounting Clerk; Business Administration; General Business; Business Management, International Business, Office Information Systems, Paralegal Studies, Call Center Representative; and Real Estate. Minimum of 24 units completed by May 2000, including 12 units in Business Education related courses. Overall GPA of 3.25 or higher. Immediate educational goal must be: a certificate, AA degree, or transfer to a four-year college. Students who have received this scholarship in prior years are not eligible. Communication skills to be demonstrated in short autobiography giving future educational plans and career goals. Submit transcript, current class schedule, and autobiography to the Financial Aid Office by **March 22, 2000**. **Judged by the Business Education Department**. Money will be awarded in the fall 2000.

COPLEY NEWSPAPER JOURNALISM

Four awards at \$250 each for continuing journalism students. Submit autobiography which states your journalism career goals and continued educational plans. Must write a thank you letter to the donor to receive this award. Submit samples of work, unofficial transcript and application. Due to Financial Aid Office **March 20, 2000**.

COX KIDS SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarships available up to \$2,500 for a **re-entry** student, at least 21 years of age. Must have a minimum of three consecutive years of stable employment or have been a stay-at-home parent preparing to re-enter the work force. Write a two-page Personal Statement explain your **re-entry status**, submit two letters of recommendation, and a sealed copy of your *high school transcripts*. **Donor application** must be sent to **donor** and postmarked by **March 27, 2000**.

DANIELS CABLEVISION

\$500 award for a video communication major who has completed 1-year at Palomar College and will continue fall 2000. Must be full-time, with a 3.0 GPA. Must reside in the Daniels Cablevision Service Area. Submit application, unofficial transcript and autobiography. Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 20, 2000**.

LESTER FORD

Four \$250 scholarships for **returning** full-time students. Two \$1000 scholarships for full-time **transferring** students. Must have a 3.25 GPA or better. Indicate financial need and submit an acceptance letter from 4-year college. Funds will be sent to 4-year college in the fall. Indicate on application **returning or transferring** fall 2000. Submit application, transcripts and autobiography. Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 22, 2000**.

GATES MILLENNIUM SCHOLARS

This award is for low-income African Americans, Asian Pacific Americans, American Indians/Alaska Natives and Hispanic Americans. Must have a 3.3 GPA and plan to be continuing in college for the 2000/2001 year. Must have financial need as defined by the Federal need analysis formula, show proof. **Please read and complete all forms completely.** Submit an official transcript. Donor applications postmarked by **March 15, 2000 to the donor.**

GOODSAMARITAN NURSING

Two awards of \$225. For a first-year student in NS117 and fourth-year student in NS218 with special financial needs and recommended by the nursing staff. It is hoped that students who receive this award will give back to other needy Palomar College students, as this donor is doing. Submit application, autobiography and unofficial transcript to **Pat Worret** in the Nursing Dept. by **March 27, 2000.**

GSDBA

Up to \$1,000 award for Gay and Lesbian students. See criteria for further information. Donor application **due to donor March 15, 2000.**

ROSE M. HARTLEY

A \$1000 award for a returning female student. This scholarship honors Rose Hartley. Submit application, unofficial transcript and autobiography to the Financial Aid Office **March 20, 2000.**

GERI HILL MEMORIAL

A \$250 scholarship for a continuing student. Must have completed at least twelve units. Must have demonstrated community or college involvement. Must be a U.S. citizen or parents must have applied for citizenship. Submit unofficial transcript, application and autobiography. This scholarship honors a very special friend and supporter to Palomar College. Due to the Financial Aid Office by **March 20, 2000.**

PALMER KRAMER TEACHING

A \$500 scholarship for books and tuition. Must be a reentry student in teaching. Must be full-time at the time of application and in the fall 2000 at Palomar College. Indicate financial need and have a 3.0 GPA. Submit application, unofficial transcript and autobiography to Financial Aid **March 20, 2000.** Scholarship committee screens, **donor selects.**

ALBERT LAVAQUE MEMORIAL

Two \$500 scholarships to nursing students enrolled in N217. The award is for spring 2000 and fall 2000. Selection is based on financial need and GPA. The scholarship is sponsored by the Escondido Voiture Unit #1406. Application, unofficial transcript and autobiography are due to the Financial Aid Office by **March 20, 2000.**

SCOTT D. LEE MEMORIAL

A \$400 scholarship for a computer information systems student with a 3.0 GPA. Scott D. Lee was a former student. Student may be continuing or transferring in the fall of 2000. Financial need and academic performance will be considered. Indicate if transferring or returning. Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 20, 2000.**

JUDY MAZZARELLA MEMORIAL

A \$300 scholarship for a transferring female athlete, accepted at a 4-year college; recommended by a Palomar College coach; and recommended by someone outside the P.E. or Athletics Dept. Award

honors former Palomar College teacher and coach. Extra consideration given to someone very motivated to succeed in school. Submit application, transcript, autobiography and letter from 4-year college. Due **March 22, 2000.**

MILSTEIN/DAVIS/TOWNSEND-MERINO

A \$1,300 scholarship (\$650 fall 2000/\$650 spring 2001) for a psychology major. Award based on overall GPA and GPA in psychology. Submit letter of recommendation, (optional) a personal statement and an unofficial transcript. Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 22, 2000. Donor selects.**

WARD (RUSTY) MYERS MEMORIAL

A \$500 scholarship for a physical education/athletics major who will be transferring to a 4-year college in the fall of 2000 to further studies in this field. Send fall schedule from transfer college and funds will be sent to that school. A 3.0 GPA is required and must have completed at least one year as P.E. major at Palomar College. Submit application, transcript, autobiography and acceptance letter from university. Indicate financial need. Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 22, 2000.** Final selection by PE/Athletics Department.

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF WOMEN IN CONSTRUCTION

Scholarships are for students pursuing a 4-year college degree, who has a parent employed in the San Diego construction industry, or a woman student pursuing a four-year college degree in construction related profession, such as Architecture, Engineering, or Construction Management. Donor application due to **donor March 24, 2000.**

JEANETTE OWEN

A \$1,000 scholarship for a transferring female student and a U. S. citizen, in at least 9 units. Must be employed and have a 3.0 GPA. Indicate financial need. Provide acceptance letter from the university. May continue one semester at Palomar, then transfer. Funds are split between two semesters. Submit application, unofficial transcript, letter of recommendation and autobiography. **Donor selects winner.** Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 20, 2000.**

MARILYN OWEN

A \$1,000 scholarship for a returning female student and a U. S. citizen, in at least 9 units with a minimum GPA of 2.5. Must be employed. Indicate financial need. Submit application, unofficial transcript, letter of recommendation and autobiography. **Donor selects winner.** Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 20, 2000.**

RONALD T. PAGE MEMORIAL

A \$100 scholarship for a major in radio, television, photography or graphic communications. Must have completed 1-year at Palomar College and be continuing in the fall. GPA of 3.0. Ron Page was a former long-time Palomar College employee. Submit unofficial transcript, autobiography and application. Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 22, 2000.**

PATRONS OF PALOMAR MELODY DAWN PITT NURSING

A \$200 scholarship for a nursing student. \$100 for fall 2000 and \$100 for spring 2001. Submit application, autobiography with career objective and transcript to the Financial Aid Office by **March 22, 2000.**

BETTY RENDEL

The National Federation of Republican Women offers this \$1,000 scholarship for an undergraduate Republican woman majoring in political science, government, or economics. Must have completed two years of coursework. Submit application, three reference letters, official transcript, and an essay and state Federation president Certification. Submit **donor** application to **donor** by **August 4, 2000**.

MARGARET RUTHERFORD

A \$200 scholarship for an outstanding full-time business student returning in the fall 2000. Submit unofficial transcript, application and autobiography to the Financial Aid Office **March 20, 2000**.

SANDIEGO COUNTY COWBELLES

For students majoring in education, research, management, or animal science relating to the beef industry. A GPA of 3.0 is required. Student must demonstrate high moral character and good citizenship. Indicate financial need. **Donor application** and unofficial transcript due to donor **July 1, 2000**.

JEAN SCINES MEMORIAL

A \$100 scholarship for a music major planning to teach piano lessons to young children. Please submit application, unofficial transcript, autobiography and two letters of recommendation. Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 24, 2000**. *Donor selects winner.*

DONALD AND DARLENE SHILEY

Two \$1,000 scholarships for full-time students returning to Palomar full-time in the fall 2000. GPA of 3.0 and demonstrate financial need. Submit applications, unofficial transcript and autobiography. Due to the Financial Aid **March 22, 2000**.

VIVIAN E. SMITH

Three \$300 scholarships for students **returning** in the fall 2000. Three \$1000 scholarships available for **transferring** students, who meet G.E. transfer requirements. Send fall schedule and funds will be sent to 4-year college. Submit acceptance letter from 4-year college. Students must demonstrate high academic achievements, financial need and community or school service. Submit transcript, application, autobiography and indicate career goals. Indicate if a **transferring or returning** student. Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 22, 2000**.

ROSE SPECTOR MEMORIAL

A \$150 scholarship for a **returning** full-time student and a \$500 scholarship for a **transferring** student who meets the G.E. transfer requirements. Transfer students indicate transfer college. Funds will be sent to transfer school upon proof of full-time enrollment. GPA of 3.0. Indicate if **returning or transferring** in the fall 2000. If transferring, submit letter from 4-year college. Application, unofficial transcript and autobiography due Financial Aid Office **March 21, 2000**.

FREDERICK W. SPEERS MEMORIAL

A \$500 scholarship for a journalism student graduating from Palomar and entering a 4-year college in the fall. Submit autobiography, financial need statement and unofficial transcript. Funds will be sent to transfer college upon proof of full-time enrollment. Indicate transfer college and submit an acceptance letter. Due to the Financial Aid on **March 20, 2000**.

SUNKIST

The A.W. Bodine Sunkist Memorial Scholarship is for a student in agriculture, or who has someone in the student's immediate family who has derived the majority of his or her income from agriculture. Indicate financial need. Must have a 3.0 GPA. Student may be in any field of study if the agriculture requirement is met. Submit application, financial information essay on agricultural background, transcript and two letters of reference. Donor application due to donor **April 30, 2000**.

BETTY J. WEBB

A \$500 scholarship for a continuing student majoring in English. Award for fall 2000. Must have completed English 100. Must have plans to transfer to a 4-year college or university. Submit two letters of recommendations from Palomar College instructors, autobiography, unofficial transcript and application. Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 16, 2000**.

EDITH WEBSTER

A \$400 scholarship for a **transferring** student who must have 60 units and transfer in the fall 2000 to a 4-year college. Indicate name of college and submit an acceptance letter from the college. Submit application, autobiography and unofficial transcript. Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 22, 2000**.

NORMAN WHEELER MEMORIAL

A \$500 scholarship for an anthropology or early world history major. Mr. Wheeler began his college career at age 65 to study anthropology. Submit autobiography, unofficial transcript and application. Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 20, 2000**.

DENISE WOODWARD MEMORIAL RETAILING AND MERCHANDISING

\$150 award to a full-time student who will transfer in the fall of 2000 to a 4-year college, indicate college. Must be a retailing and merchandising major. Submit unofficial transcript, application and autobiography. Funds will be sent to the 4-year college, upon proof of full-time registration. Due to the Financial Aid Office **March 22, 2000**.

SELMA ZARAKOV-OPIE, Ed.D. BILL OPIE, REALTOR

A \$250 award for a reentry, single parent, male or female. Must have completed 30 units of transfer credit with a 2.8 GPA. Must demonstrate by an Education Plan, his/her intent to complete the requirements in a Counseling or Psychology major at a 4-year university. Letter of recommendation by a Palomar counselor is required. Submit application, unofficial transcript and autobiography to the Financial Aid Office **March 22, 2000**.

Most scholarships will be awarded for the fall 2000. Students who win scholarships are encouraged to attend the annual Scholarship Honors Night Program.
