

## Palomar College International Baccalaureate (IB) Program Chart

Students must have International Baccalaureate send an official transcript to the Palomar College Records Office.

**Course credit and units granted at Palomar College may differ from course credit and units granted by a transfer institution.**

Students may earn Palomar College and CSU System credit for International Baccalaureate (IB) examination scores of 4, 5, 6, or 7 on the HL (Higher Level) exams only. UC System credit may be awarded for scores of 5, 6, or 7 on the HL (Higher Level) exams only. IB credit may be used to meet AA GE, CSU GE, and IGETC requirements.

\*IB Curriculum offers language at various levels for native and non-native speakers. Language B courses are offered at the intermediate level for non-natives. Language A1 and A2 are advanced courses in literature for native and non-native speakers, respectively.

Students who have completed the Mathematics HL exam may have eligibility for MATH 100 through 120. The exam does not equate to any specific course at Palomar.

The History (any region) HL exam cannot be used to meet any component of the American History & Institutions requirement.

**AA:** A student who receives IB credit and who then takes a comparable PC course will have the unit credit for such duplication deducted (usually from the exam) prior to being awarded an AA degree.

**CSU/UC GE:** All CSU and UC campuses will accept the minimum units shown and apply them toward fulfillment of the designated area if the examination is included as part of a full, partial, or subject-area certification. Each CSU/UC campus will determine how it will apply examinations toward transfer credit for admission or toward major prep.

^**IGETC:** English language may not be used to meet the Area 6A, Language Other Than English (LOTE), requirement.
