- I. The meeting was called to order by Tom Plotts at 3:43 p.m.**
- II. Approval of Minutes-April 17, 2008** MSC – (Emerick-Locher-Barrett)
- III. Items for Discussion – 1st Reading**
 - a. 08-09 Goals (Plotts)**

Tom Plotts suggested all members consider goals for the CPC committee to pursue for the 2008-2009 year and bring their suggestions to the next meeting to be discussed in an open forum.
 - b. Enforcement return to 24/7-365 days per year (Plotts)**

Tom Plotts proposed the issue of mandatory permits 24/7-365 be added to next month's meeting agenda. Plotts commented that the only exception would be if a department submitted a planned event form. He pointed out this would be fair and equitable for everybody. Discussion followed regarding the advantages of the 24/7 parking enforcement issue. It was also mentioned that the police department would continue to not cite during the first two weeks of each semester. Titus mentioned she would like a representative from the cashier's office to speak at the next CPC meeting so they could relate the impact the two-week grace period has on that department. Titus suggested Lambert ask Bob Baird (cashier supervisor) if he will speak at the next CPC meeting.
- IV. Items for Information/Action – 2nd Reading**
 - a. Update on the request by Neil Kovrig for an additional CCE member to be added to the committee (Plotts)**

Plotts noted that Lambert had contacted Becky McCluskey, and was assured that CCE members were in the process of selecting a member to join the CPC. Discussion followed regarding the preferred qualifications of a new member.

V. Other

- a. Titus inquired as to the needs of the police department. Plotts commented the Workgroup did a great job with their recommendations and noted that Campus Police is staffed from 6:30am-11-11:30pm every day. Also, due to the budget crisis, no additional positions can be added at this time to accommodate a graveyard shift. Additional needs were mentioned.
- b. There was discussion of problems in the walkway by the NS building. (Cummins) Cars are being driven on the walkway which is hazardous to the pedestrians. The option of installing posts was discussed. Cruz will discuss this situation further with Cummins to develop procedures and ideas for resolving the problem.
- c. Plotts listed the items he had submitted to President Deegan for one-time purchases for equipment and supplies. Discussion followed detailing the need of updated basic equipment for security both in the Police Department and Campus wide. He is planning on presenting his proposals to the SPC on 10/21/08.
- d. Titus congratulated the Police Department on their efforts to obtain evidence that resulted in a conviction for the person responsible for all of the recent bomb threat calls to Palomar College.
