



Campus Police Advisory Committee MINUTES

April 15, 2004

A meeting of the Palomar College Police Advisory Committee was held on April 15, 2004, at 3:30 p.m., in room A4C.

I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Jerry Patton at 3:35 p.m. New members Carol Naddi and Larry Roberts were introduced.

II. Review of Minutes

The minutes of the January 15, 2004 meeting were approved.

III. Items for Discussion - 1st Reading

There were no items on the agenda.

IV. Items for Discussion – 2nd Reading

- a. Progress report on Police Survey (Bean)
The third draft was presented to Research and Planning department. They suggested that this survey not be presented now to avoid jeopardizing and minimizing the impact on other surveys now in process on campus. Committee decided to table this survey until late fall or early spring. However, Norma will send the survey to members to look over the wording of the questions. Please get back to her with your comments.
- b. Report on Parking Meters in Riverside (Medel)
Police Department will present a power point presentation next month.
- c. Update on Reciprocal Permit Agreement with CSUSM (Patton)
The VP's have asked CSUSM to reconsider the reciprocal agreement between our colleges. There has been no response. Discussion concluded that we would wait for their response but we would continue honoring their permits regardless of the outcome.
- d. Discussion on plan to solve crosswalk problems on Comet Circle.
Safety and Security and Facilities Review committees recommend that the chain link fence be closed at the current opening across from Lot 11 and extended to the crosswalk. This change would accommodate and fit in with the current CPO building being relocated to this area next to Comet Circle. Closing this entrance/exit would also provide more staff spaces in Lot 12.
Discussion brought up the following problems:
 - Access to Lot 11 from Lot 12 would have to be redirected via the road in front of the T building to Comet Circle (until such time that Comet Circle becomes 2-way).
 - Traffic flow could become a problem.
 - Chain link fence is unsightly and there would be no vegetation around it.

It was suggested that the old crosswalk be totally resurfaced as the paint over the old lines are still visible and confusing. Also, the speed bump should be relocated back towards Lot 10 to provide the slow-down at a safer distance prior to the crosswalk.

- e. Result of meeting with Deans regarding Lot 1 and 2 (Patton).
The history of the problem was discussed. Patton has met with the Deans and the new procedures now in place will be tested and evaluated by semester to see if they will solve the problems.

V. **Other**

Discussion on Escondido Center, i.e. Escondido P.D. and student parking when tenants vacate.
