4. List the various laws which control the moral conduct of the population.

The student will develop five fictitious sets of facts involving crimes. He/she will list the elements of the crime described, state the level of crime, and indicate the punishment associated with the crime. Additionally, the student will list any lesser included offenses, their elements and punishment.
