ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

PREREQUISITE: Completion of, or concurrent enrollment in ASL 100

RECOMMENDED PREPARATION: None

SCOPE OF COURSE:

Individualized program intended for students who wish to further improve their ASL skills. Students will utilize videotapes, software, and workbooks in the American Sign Language/English Interpreting Lab to improve comprehension of basic ASL sentences and stories. Through the use of video recording equipment, students will have the opportunity to improve their expressive signing skills. Lab activities are designed to provide students the opportunity to practice vocabulary and syntax taught in ASL 100.

SPECIFIC COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Complete 48 hours of lab work for the purpose of improving comprehension of American Sign Language. Students will create a video portfolio of their own expressive skills. Using written English, students will also complete workbook exercises, create written summaries of ASL narratives and/or translate basic ASL sentences.

CONTENT IN TERMS OF SPECIFIC BODY OF KNOWLEDGE:

Students will practice and improve their ability to:

- I. Comprehend beginning ASL narratives
- II. Expand and reinforce ASL vocabulary learned in ASL 100
- III. Produce ASL signs using appropriate sign parameters
- IV. Use grammatically correct ASL syntax and non-manual signals to produce the following:
 - Simple declarative sentences
 - Yes/No questions
 - 'Wh' or 'H' word questions

Simple topic comment sentences
Sentences expressing negation and/or assertion
Sentences which show subject/object agreement through the use of directional verbs

V. Use appropriate classifiers to describe:

Physical appearance
Clothing
Sizes and shapes of objects
Patterns or designs on objects
How simple objects function

VI. Increase awareness of Deaf culture by viewing videotaped lectures and narratives and completing workbook exercises.
