**SCOPE OF COURSE:**

The study of techniques used in drawing and painting from both nude and costumed models.

**SPECIFIC COURSE OBJECTIVES:**

Students will identify a goal in written form that they will use to improve their ability to draw and paint from the model, and define objectives to meet their designated goal.

Examples of appropriate goals include:

Improve ability to see and draw proportion.

Improve ability to paint realistic drapery.

To successfully pass this course, students will work towards fulfillment of their stated goals by:

- Having necessary materials (as determined by goal).
- Initiating discussions with fellow students and illustrators about media and techniques.
- Having a positive and cooperative attitude by attending class regularly and on time.

**CONTENT IN TERMS OF SPECIFIC BODY OF KNOWLEDGE:**

Students have the option to work with the media of their choice, explore techniques they are learning in other classes, and question and observe professional illustrators and artists to practice new techniques. Specific body of knowledge to be determined by each student, and based on their stated goal.

General process is as follows:

- I. Identify goal
  - A. Collect personal body of work
  - B. Critique personal body of work
  - C. Determine area of need in work
  - D. Write goal
  
- II. Develop approach to meeting goal
  - A. Media to be used
  - B. Scale of work
  - C. Quantity of work to be created
  - D. Means of assessment of goal
  
- III. Creation of agreed upon body of work
  - A. Drawing and/or painting from model
  - B. Critiques of work
  - C. Modification of work based on critiques
