1. recognize and treat life-threatening emergencies, including cardiac arrest and choking.
2. recognize breathing difficulty in children.
3. prevent injuries in infant and children.
4. relieve choking for infants (0 – 1 yr.) and children (1 – 8 yrs.).
5. demonstrate the appropriate skills needed for CPR in infants and children.
6. recognize the need for first aid care.
7. demonstrate the appropriate skills needed for first aid for infants and children.
8. administer inhaled medication to children with respiratory needs.
