SUGGESTED READING:

Students are encouraged to go beyond the mandatory assignments and to pursue projects pertinent to the broader historical and cultural dimensions of the study of the Chinese-speaking peoples. A number of books and journals are presented and discussed from time to time in class. Supplemental handouts on the use of various tense forms and sentence structures are available in Chinese.

REQUIRED WRITING:

Weekly short essay or conversation exercises as well as translation exercises regarding the material being studied. Approximately thirty sentences to be prepared per week.

OUTSIDE ASSIGNMENTS:

Students are expected to spend a minimum of three hours per unit per week in class and on outside assignments, prorated for short term classes.

Reading and writing assignments. Students will study the textbook and prepare for exams.
