COURSE NUMBER AND TITLE: CNED 441 QUILTING

MINIMUM NUMBER OF SEMESTER HOURS: 24

SCOPE OF COURSE:

This class presents the design and execution of various techniques to produce a quilt. A variety of quilt designs will be presented.

SPECIFIC COURSE OBJECTIVES:

The student will:

1. Draft and cut quilt patterns.
2. Demonstrate competence in machine, hand-piecing, and appliqué quilting.
3. Piece the quilt top.
4. Baste quilt top with batting and backing and finish edging.
5. Learn decorative quilting stitches to finish project.
6. Incorporate creativity in use of color and design in quilting projects.
7. Learn a variety of historical quilt patterns.
8. Work toward completion of project of choice over the course of the semester

CONTENT IN TERMS OF SPECIFIC BODY OF KNOWLEDGE:

- I. Drafting and designing a variety of quilt patterns
- II. Relationship of color and pattern in quilt design
- III. Choosing compatible fabrics
- IV. Maximizing efficiency in the cutting of pieces for quilt blocks
- V. Machine or hand-piece blocks together
- VI. Speed techniques
- VII. Machine and hand appliqué
- VIII. Hand quilting and finishing the quilt top
- IX. Creating a personal quilt design

MATERIALS REQUIRED:

Students to provide own supplies to include: fabric, thread, scissors, rotary cutter, cutting mat with grid, graph paper, grid ruler, colored pencils and, if desired, a sewing machine.

TEXTS RECOMMENDED OR REQUIRED:

Many quilting books are brought into class as references. Handouts supplied by the instructor illustrate different patterns and techniques.
