COURSE NUMBER AND TITLE: CNED 646 Learning Skills - Handicapped

MINIMUM NUMBER OF SEMESTER HOURS: 48

SCOPE OF COURSE:

This course focuses on independent living skills for the developmentally delayed population. Practical application of basic skills and their use in life situations will be stressed. Computer laboratory may be used to augment instruction.

SPECIFIC COURSE OBJECTIVES:

1. Students will reinforce practical math skills and their application to life and work situations.
2. Students will learn practical reading skills and their application to life and work situations.
3. Students will focus on improving written and oral communication skills for their application to life and work situations.
4. Each student will work with the instructor in developing an Individual Education Plan (IEP).

CONTENT IN TERMS OF SPECIFIC BODY OF KNOWLEDGE:

1. MATH
 - Money - money management, banking skills, consumer skills
 - Calculators - operation, application, practice
2. READING
 - Comprehension - basic reading materials
 - Development - community survival skills and dictionary usage
3. WRITTEN LANGUAGE
 - Personal expression - journal writing, customized dictionary
 - Social expression - letter writing, vocabulary development
4. ORAL LANGUAGE
 - Social interaction
 - Language development
 - Telephone skills
5. TECHNOLOGY
 - Computer - word processing, tutorials for reading and consumer math
 - Spell checkers - support for oral and written communication
6. PERSONAL ISSUES
 - Personal safety
 - Community awareness
 - Continuing personal growth
 - Enrichment through mastery of everyday tasks and attempting new activities

INSTRUCTIONAL METHODOLOGY:

The instructor will incorporate a variety of teaching methods such as group instruction, role playing, small group activities, guest speakers, and individual interaction.
