1. Administer direct patient care in accordance with requirements of contract.

CONTENT IN TERMS OF SPECIFIC BODY OF KNOWLEDGE:

- I. Assess and manage patient care to include:
 - A. Paramedic level patient assessment.
 - B. Administration of paramedic level medications.
 - C. Identification and maintenance of the airway with or without BLS or ALS adjuncts.
 - D. CPR including Advanced Life Support measures.
 - E. Identification and treatment of medical and trauma patients.
