

REQUIRED READING:

The required readings will vary from course to course, project to project, but will be designed by the instructor to allow the student to reach the goals and objectives set for the topic determined by the student and the instructor. The instructor, in choosing the readings will take into mind the experience of the student, his or her level of expertise in the topic, the books available on the subject. In addition, the instructor will suggest various methods of discovering new material on the topic at hand.

SUGGESTED READING:

Suggested readings in the chosen area will include those of a more specific, or detailed nature on the topic than those specifically required to fulfill the course requirements, objectives, and goals. These might include indications of where to locate further materials on the topic, source books, indexes, etc., statements of current research, dissertations in progress, magazine articles, and current debate and politics among scholars in the field on the topic chosen by the student.

REQUIRED WRITING:

A composition, a paper of theoretical analysis, or an appropriate written document are some examples of the kind of written work which might be required depending on the type of project involved. (3-10 pages in length)

OUTSIDE ASSIGNMENTS:

Students are expected to spend a minimum of three hours per unit per week in class and on outside assignments, prorated for short term classes.

Time spent composing, time in the library researching, time spent in theoretical analysis, once again varying from project to project. (three hours per week)
