SCOPE OF COURSE:

Private studio instruction on instrument or voice with an off campus instructor, plus on campus training in performance skills including: 1) Twelve clock hours of instruction with a private instructor and adequate practice time are required, and 2) At the end of the semester the student will be required to perform for the Music faculty.

SPECIFIC COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Students will:

1. Demonstrate rehearsal skills under the supervision of a qualified instructor;
2. Demonstrate increased technical skills through exercises, scales, etc. endemic to student's instrument;
3. Synthesize and demonstrate a well-balanced repertoire of pieces for his/her instrument;
4. Demonstrate performance skills under the supervision of a qualified instructor;
5. Demonstrate the interpretive skills appropriate to the stylistic period of the piece being played.

CONTENT IN TERMS OF SPECIFIC BODY OF KNOWLEDGE:

- I. Twelve clock hours of private instruction off campus on chosen instrument; acquisition of technical skills on chosen instrument.
- II. Performance experience, provided by repeated opportunities to perform for classmates in class, others in "Friday Recitals" and the public in "Student Recitals."
- III. "Master class" information from classroom instructor. The instructor critiques each performer, while others watch. Thus, the class members learn from this interaction as the performing student learns.
- IV. Video tape self-evaluation allows individual student to see him/herself as if from the audience, and to review all the details of the critique given by instructor and class.
- V. Performance jury: in lieu of final exam, the student performs for a jury of all the music faculty. The full faculty then offer encouragement and suggestions for improvement.

REQUIRED READING:

It is impossible to list the required readings for each particular instrument in the Performance Studies course, but a general listing of these is as follows:

Each student is assigned, at the beginning of the semester, specific compositions which are to be learned by the student during the course of his or her study with the private instructor and are to be performed at the group class meetings on campus, with the assigned instructor. These compositions are chosen by the student with the advice of the private instructors, and according to criteria developed for each instrument. These criteria will include the learning of compositions as well as technical exercises designed to increase the students skill at the instrument.

SUGGESTED READING:

Material on performance anxiety (xeroxed articles) on instructor reserve.

REQUIRED WRITING:

1. Self-evaluations of each video taped performance. (1-2 pages)
2. Skill demonstration in class.

OUTSIDE ASSIGNMENTS:

Students are expected to spend a minimum of three hours per unit per week in class and on outside assignments, prorated for short term classes.

1. Completion of instructor agreement cards (blue cards).
2. Self evaluations, covered above.
3. Completion of any specially assigned material - forms, programs, etc. for Friday Recital.
4. Practice (1-2 hours daily, in most cases).
