PREREQUISITE: Basic singing and sight reading experience.

RECOMMENDED PREPARATION: None

SCOPE OF COURSE:

Sight-singing and part-singing techniques will be stressed. Study choral rehearsal planning, conducting techniques and analysis of choral literature for elementary, junior high and senior high choirs. Vocal training for participants and vocal pedagogy for children emphasized.

SPECIFIC COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Upon completion of course the successful student will be able to:

1. Explain how to plan and implement the plan for rehearsal and performance;
2. Analyze and organize choral music for all levels;
3. Develop good vocal technique and know how to teach correct vocal technique;
4. Prepare and teach a specific choral work;
5. Prepare concert repertoire with specific objectives for learning and performance.

CONTENT IN TERMS OF SPECIFIC BODY OF KNOWLEDGE:

- I. Practice in a sequential approach to selecting appropriate repertoire and in preparing it for performance.
- II. Gaining specific knowledge and practice in the elements of good vocal production from a physiological and psychological approach.

REQUIRED READING:

Selected articles on choral analysis, choral literature, and choral music.

Students are expected to spend a minimum of three hours per unit per week in class and on outside assignments, prorated for short term classes.
