# A. Cross-listing/De-Cross-listing Policies

The Curriculum Committee needs to develop policies for cross-listing and de-cross-listing courses. There are some good reasons to cross-list but there can also be problems related to funding and minimum qualifications among others. Cross-listing opens the pool of faculty which can teach a course and boosts enrollment. However, some departments are not in agreement with minimum qualifications. There are ongoing conversations about these issues across campus. Potential policies would address guidelines where cross-listing is okay and the curriculum aspect of cross-listing as opposed to any bias about who teaches the course.

#### B. New Course vs. Course Change

The attachment defining what the Chancellor's Office characterizes a substantive (new course) or non-substantive change was reviewed. By policy, substantive changes generate a new course control number and should have a new catalog number. The Chancellor's Office has not been following the rules to the letter but as policies are changed to better reflect the rules implemented long ago, Palomar needs to keep this information on the radar. Faculty must be very cautious when making curriculum changes which affect units, TOP Codes, credit status and other data elements. As a college, we must become better aligned with the terminology used by the Chancellor's Office with respect to our own terminology for how changes are defined.

# XI. Reports (Two minutes)

#### A. Prerequisite Approvals/Rose

There were twenty-four courses approved and sixteen pending. The subcommittee met and discussed a more efficient way to evaluate requisites. There is a place in Curricunet to house the validation information entered on an outside chart. This information will be housed in Curricunet instead of being kept separately.

#### B. Academic Technology/Payn

The Teaching with Technology Showcase will be announced next week and is for online, hybrid and face-to-face courses using technology. The CANVAS pilot is close to being launched. Academic Technology Resource Center, Academic Technology Committee and Professional Development are all working together to develop on the methodology for this. A request was sent asking for participants in the pilot. A survey was also sent seeking feedback for Blackboard as well as any experience using CANVAS. The contract from CANVAS has been received outlining the services offered, how many students may participate and the support and services included in the pilot. Lillian was a part of a webinar which included schools who adopted CANVAS and their experiences during their transition. Lillian discussed a new product offered by CCConfer called ZOOM. ZOOM is similar to Blackboard Collaborate but uses no JAVA. It is easy to play it on numerous platforms. Online Education Initiative (OEI) is ongoing and they continue to develop policies. They are currently offering eight courses. New initiatives being discussed include how to calculate FTES for online courses and fee based programs at the community college level including community education, vocational training and continuing education. Twenty-four colleges have been accepted and approved to take place in this initiative. They will meet in November. A single sign-on for all California Community Colleges is being sought through CCCApply.

#### C. Accreditation/Sourbeer

The Fire Academy was reaffirmed with the evaluator stating that it is one of the best, if not the best, in the state. Nursing was reaffirmed by ACEN with one curriculum recommendation which was self-identified. They are now preparing for BRN accreditation which is a stricter process. The Accreditation Steering Committee is preparing for next October's visit and working on PRP involvement across campus. This is a part of the communication recommendation Palomar received and it is very important that we are in compliance by next fall as opposed to on the way to compliance. The curriculum recommendation will be brought to the Curriculum Committee.

## D. Articulation/DeMaris

State requires 3 levels of competency to satisfy the American History and Institutions requirement. This may currently be accomplished by taking course pairs which contain whole and partial portions of the competencies. There is movement to make these competencies more distinctive with each being one separate course. More clarification is being sought with the hope that course pair requirements prior to 2017 will be grandfathered. Finally, a new Articulation Officer will be starting soon.

#### E. Basic Skills/Sivert

Request for the Faculty Resource Coordinator was released to the Faculty Senate today. This is forty percent release time position is for working in the TLC and with the TLC Supervisor and FYE Coordinator. The work includes Learning Communities, mentoring programs and other work. Larry Lawson has been serving in this position for the last year and a half.

The committee broke into smaller groups and discussed matters surrounding cross-listing. Reasons for cross-listing as well as reasons for not cross-listing were discussed. Potential problems surrounding adding or removing cross-listings were offered. The committee will come back and potentially develop a checklist or policy for these issues.

## C. University Studies Degrees

There was discussion surrounding these degrees. Many students complete these degrees but they are not "owned" by any department and are not assessed. There are concerns that many departments did not know of these degrees existence and were not consulted when they were developed. They were developed at the request of the Chancellor's Office in 2009. Departments fear that these degrees are impacting their programs and the pattern of courses gives students no practical outcomes. Some departments like them but many faculty agree that they need to be re-evaluated. There are also questions as to whether the development of ADTs will negate the need for these.

D. Policy Change Related to Submission of Credit Course Nonsubstantial Change Proposals

The Chancellor's Office (CO) is refining hours and units to better ensure adherence to the Carnegie
Unit. The CO sent a communication to all colleges outlining construction of units to include classroom
instruction as well as homework hours. Relating to this communication, a procedure was developed
for the college to certify the correct calculation of course hours and units by way of signature from
the CIO. The CO will then spot check courses to ensure compliance thereby speeding course approval.

Jenny compiled a draft of a checklist based upon feedback from the committee's breakout groups. She and Dan will look closely at the draft and fine-tune it a bit more. They will then report back to the committee.

#### C. University Studies Degrees

Based upon responses from department chairs, Jenny concluded that there is not much knowledge about University Studies Degrees. There was only one chair who knew about the existence of these degrees and little knowledge from others regarding the impact these degrees may be having on their programs. One department was willing to be responsible for the upkeep and assessment of one of the degrees containing its courses. Jenny will continue investigating these degrees with department chairs. Some departments are curious as to whether more courses may be added to the degrees. PJ and Lori acknowledged that the courses contained in these programs must be a part of major preparation for transfer. Research and Planning has said that it is difficult to know how other degrees are impacted. We would need program data prior to the inception of the University Studies degrees.

#### D. Hours/Unit Calculation

Richard discussed the communication distributed by the Chancellor's Office regarding the fine-tuning of the calculation of hours and units. These guidelines are currently in effect and all curriculum should be evaluated to ensure compliance to the new formula which includes homework hours. We must certify that calculations for non-substantial changes are correct. Substantial changes will be evaluated individually.

#### E. AP 4260 – Prerequisites, Corequisites and Advisories

Policies and Procedures has asked the Curriculum Committee to address this policy to bring Palomar into compliance. There is little knowledge about how a student may challenge a requisite. A clear procedure needs to be developed, implemented and distributed. A workgroup consisting of Jenny, Craig, Lori, Richard, Patti and Dan will meet to draft a policy which they will bring back to the rest of the committee.

#### A. Prerequisite Approvals/Dixon

Four courses were approved and three are pending.

## B. Academic Technology/Payn

A PeopleSoft update will be done which will allow faculty to integrate with other systems. Thirteen faculty are participating in the CANVAS pilot. A faculty workshop will be offered and student accommodations are being addressed. Preparations for the Palomar Teaching with Technology Showcase are beginning. The showcase is for face-to-face, online, hybrid or any other class instructors who use technology for teaching. A workshop will be offered to help instructors present their entries in February.

## C. Accreditation/Sourbeer

Accreditation has developed two rudimentary graphs that address our two recommendations. They will continue to be developed. The Board of Governors unanimously directed the Chancellor's office to develop a new model for accrediting the system's colleges.

#### D. Articulation/DeMaris

P.J. attended a conference at USC and is very excited to potentially develop a few more engineering course articulations which currently don't exist. Palomar should be looking at a few more things which would expand our articulation options with private and out-of-state colleges. Tuition has often prevented students from taking advantage of these options. There is a program call WUE (Western

Undergraduate Exchange) which is essentially a tuition break. Once the tuition break is factored in, the cost is pretty comparable with the UC system. Students need to be made more aware of this program. The more articulations we can develop, the better opportunities for our students.

E. Basic Skills/Sivert - There was no report.

# F. Counseling/DeMaris

Counseling is very excited that they will receive three new counselors. They are working very closely on the new academic advising program. Their goal is to develop a robust academic advising program with instructional faculty.

#### G. Distance Learning Approvals/Gushansky

Six courses were approved, three are pending. Approved were ASL 101L, 205L, 206L; CS 140; CSCI 130; FASH 105

## H. Learning Outcomes/Furch

The Written Communication results were finalized. Thirty-eight courses and a little more than eight hundred and fifty students were a part of the assessment. The results found that approximately 81% of the students assessed were competent in writing. These results surprised many. The focus group recommends that written communication be assessed again. This was the first time a holistic rubric was used. Among other statistics, the assessment found that students that had more units scored higher and those for whom English is the second language spoken in the home scored significantly lower. There was no information gathered as to where the assessment exercise was done. Some may have been an in class artifact while others may have been done outside the classroom.

The SLO Facilitator report has received a really good response. The purpose it was developed for is being successfully met. Among the responses for why courses have not been assessed is they have not been offered for a while. Other responses simply include "no assessment." Learning Outcomes will continue to look at these reports and determine how best to support faculty.

The CP is short because the BA program at CSUSM currently requires only 5 classes as the lower division preparation for the major. The proposed AS in Environmental Studies and Sustainability builds upon some of the courses in the CP. The requirements for the AS was chosen by comparing the lower division prep among the UC schools that have Environmental Studies related programs.

This CP has been developed in response to the newly launched Environmental Studies major launched at CalState San Marcos. This major has been doubling enrollment every year. Students can take the lower division prep courses for the major here at Palomar. There is an Environmental Studies 100 course that is only offered at CalState San Marcos but with cross-enrollment, student may take this course for only \$10 per course. They can finish all the lower division prep here at Palomar and get an Environmental Studies Certificate of Proficiency within two semesters. Semesters three, four, five and six are the upper division major courses at CalState San Marcos. Within six semesters, students can finish all of the major courses for Environmental Studies in six semesters.

#### B. Cross-listing/De-Cross-listing Policies

A document concerning cross-listing was distributed. The draft consisted of a larger overview of cross-listing definitions and options as well as a checklist for creating and removing cross-listings. The document was discussed in detail and minor suggestions and clarifications were offered. Jenny asked that the committee submit any final suggestions or language recommendations in preparation for a final draft.

# C. General Education Program/Furch

This topic was continued from the fall semester. Jenny posed the question of how to proceed with the work of cleaning up our general education (GE) requirements. Marty reminded us of some of the past events regarding GE. This conversation is happening across the country. What does GE mean to us and our students? How are courses selected for GE? Is it an articulation only selection or some other process? How do we assess GE as a program? Now, many students (and parents) look at GE as a checklist of courses they have to take instead of looking at how GE courses may be beneficial. Should students become more involved in selecting GE courses according to their interests or should faculty recommend GE according to major? Marty outlined the GE Outcomes Palomar has adopted utilizing the LEAP model and there was discussion about what GE could potentially mean to the campus and students in general. It was agreed that it's time to address these questions and the curriculum committee should be a part of the process. Dan made a suggestion to create a taskforce to help address the direction of this important work. Marty mentioned utilizing a potential NCHEA grant with other local institutions to collaborate on this work. #### A. Prerequisite Approvals/Dixon

A few courses have arrived in the queue but there have been slow responses. There were some Real

Estate courses in queue which were supposed to have the prerequisites removed but that hasn't happened yet. There is a complicated course that is being addressed.

## B. Academic Technology/Payn

POET Stats: Completed since 2012, 108 have been trained. This includes 27 external certificates from other colleges and universities. This academic year, there have been 17 trained; 14 during the fall semester and 3 already in January. The streaming server update is happening. The previous server was 32 bit and the new one is 64 and there are updates too numerous for limited staff to address. Palomar was not in compliance with the TEACH Act and this will allow us to be. At their first meeting, they discussed the purpose for the document and guessed that not many people read it based upon the fact that it does not accurately reflect how we handle these issues as a college. The group also discussed how information like this may need to be communicated to the campus community. The first meeting included Patti, Jenny, Greg, Richard and Candace. Since the document discusses enforcement, it was decided that Kendyl Magnuson needed to be included at the next ones. Kendyl participated in the next meeting and was asked why every course prerequisite is not electronically enforced. He explained that PeopleSoft has the capability to do this but it is more of a decision that needs to be made as a campus. Do we want every course that has a prerequisite to block students from enrolling automatically? Doing so could drastically affect enrollment as students may have satisfied prerequisites at other colleges but don't have transcripts on file. These students could potentially miss enrolling in a class as it could fill before they have taken care of verifying transcripts, etc. Questions included why we have prerequisites that we don't want enforced and what impact does uneven enforcement have? Student Services also does not have the manpower to go through all of the transcripts in a timely manner. Kendyl suggested a gradual shift which is essentially what we have been doing but further discussion about how to continue to move forward is needed campus-wide. Data can be pulled to fuel this discussion based upon departments who currently have prerequisites. Information in the policy was redefined to more accurately reflect what faculty do versus what the curriculum committee does. Jenny discussed other changes and language the group is not sure is needed. They will meet again and keep the committee updated on the progress of this policy.

#### B. General Education Program

GE Workgroup has met once. Those that met were Marty, Craig, Cheryl, Ben, Patrick O'Brien

(Counseling), Kevin and Jenny. The group met based on the conversation about GE we had in the fall based on changes that will be coming from the state level and the reframing of how we look at GE. The group looked at the three general education tracks available for students. Discussion included that students mostly value convenience. This means they look at which courses they can get into and which fits their schedule. Currently, the way GE is presented to students does resemble a checklist. The group looked at each list within the tracks and how courses make it onto the list. Some are there because the CSU or IGETC decide are lower division preparation and some are decided upon locally. Some courses on these lists get old and while courses are always added, older courses are not evaluated to see if they are still relevant. The group recognized that an audit of GE courses could be beneficial to determine if courses are being offered regularly enough and if enrollment supports the course being GE. Suggestions to make GE more meaningful to students included having tracks for GE e.g. STEM major GE courses. There was concern with this that students may not get the well rounded experience they may receive as a result of trying different courses outside of their majors. Patrick discussed how Counselors must guide students through this vast set of options. Some counselors tell students exactly which courses to take which means that some courses may be recommended more than others. Communication about student advising needs to be looked at. Our "laundry list" of courses may or may not be effective toward achieving the outcomes we want for GE. Faculty is not always aware of the courses on the GE lists and students don't always know what they want to do in their first semester. Marty pointed out that we all pretty much agree that GE should be used to build a well-rounded depth and breadth in the student educational experience and to give students the opportunity to look at different areas outside their major. The question is how do we help our students be more successful and make the courses more meaningful, beneficial and enjoyable to them. The answer may not be to necessarily create a pathway for students but to evaluate how well students are doing in them and evaluate which courses are included in the GE and what those courses need to achieve e.g. critical thinking, writing skill, etc. The GE list we currently have points not to skills but to courses. The college's mission may need to be consulted and the question of how these courses fit be considered. It may be beneficial to develop some pathways or general ideas for GE. The next workgroup meeting is Tuesday March 1 from 3:30 pm - 5:00 pm. Our goal should be to develop an action plan which makes GE more meaningful to all students.

Candace voiced concern about possible overlap between these types of courses in Graphics and Drafting and suggested a conversation with Dennis Lutz. This course has to do with design of a product which is turned into a 3D model. Conversation has taken place between the two departments and everyone is fine with the curriculum development. Jenny cautioned that the course outlines of record for these types of courses and CAD/CAM types of courses should be

sufficiently different. SLOs for this course still need to be entered. It is a good idea to have assessments done sooner, preferably after the first year. As for textbooks, online resources are more up-to-date due to the rapidly changing technology. Articulation with the CSU requires at least some representative texts which are at least within five years. There were questions about standalone status for this course. The course is proposed for a program which has yet to be developed and approved.

Mark will work with Candace and Cheryl to accomplish this. Mark discussed the legalities surrounding drones and the policy which is still being defined by the FAA. Consumers can file for a license but commercial usage is still being decided. Palomar is ahead of other colleges with offering this technology. Palomar will adhere to all of the rules once they are defined. Policies and Procedures have been discussing drone use on campus and will accommodate for classes. Mark mentioned a flyover video he posted of the new Child Development Lab School received a number of comments of Facebook and users were tagging friends interested in Child Development at Palomar.

#### V. DISCUSSION

#### A. AP 4260 – Prerequisites, Corequisites and Advisories

The workgroup met and after discussion, decided that the policy should be separated into two areas specific to Curriculum and Student Services. There were many methods for challenging a requisite and the group decided to consolidate them all into one area of the policy. The group will meet again for further discussion. The policy is sound but the procedure is problematic. Additionally, Lori Waite pointed out that the current policy is very discriminatory for certain students.

#### **B.** General Education Program

The workgroup for GE met and determined some guiding questions: What is our GE, how do we revisit our GE, what are Title 5 GEs, who are the players for GE determination and what is the process for the transfer and approval process for GE courses? Discussion surrounding these questions led to a preliminary action plan which includes:

- Evaluate currency of courses in GE
- Determine what prerequisites exist for GE courses and do those prerequisites meet GE
- Determine which courses are taken for GE versus the major
- Survey students and faculty for perceptions of GE
- Mapping or GE and Institutional Learning Outcomes

Trends for GE are developing across the country. This is a conversation that needs to happen especially during an enrollment crisis. We also need to gage student perception and interest.

## C. External Audit Online Summary File/Kahn

Jack Kahn presented an idea for a master spreadsheet that would contain everything happening involving curriculum. The worksheet would be updated as each area is updated and be available to the entire group. This would make tracking of subjects easier. There were questions surrounding the idea regarding who would make the updates to the sheet and where it would be located.

## D. CLEP/Mudgett

Ben explained that CLEP is essentially an external credit by exam. He presented a list of CLEP courses and discussed how the process works. He voiced concern that about acceptance at CSUs. UCs currently do not accept CLEP courses. Though the latest CLEP listing was last updated in March of 2014, faculty may not have been consulted. Ben will be contacting departments which have CLEP

courses for their perspective. He will bring this information back to the Curriculum Committee for further discussion afterward.

It was advised that a gradual phase-in strategy be developed to begin the implementation once developed. It is not clear if there is a procedure for program requisites.

Jenny reported the presentation given at Faculty Senate regarding the Adult Education Block grant. Barbara Blanchard and Suzanne Sebring discussed the grant and the progress so far. # E. Nursing

Hope Farquharson discussed the changes to the Nursing curriculum they are being forced to make. Their accrediting body is mandating a reduction in units for some degrees and the elimination of others. The curriculum is outdated and the department is changing it to meet accrediting standards. They are looking at a two year follow-up report. During this time they are requesting the Curriculum Committee assist in finding a solution. They are requesting that conversations with History and Humanities be started as a way of helping decrease some of the General Education requirements.

A. Prerequisite Approvals/Dixon - Eight courses approved, twenty-eight in progress

## B. Academic Technology/Payn

Academic Technology is still dealing with any issues with the new streaming server. Continue submitting media; it is a smooth process once entered. Academic Technology workgroups are discussing Digital Literacy and what it should look like for student success. The Canvas panel is deciding whether Canvas is a good choice. Students seem to like it and are familiar with it. So far, Cuyamaca and Grossmont have decided, though not officially, to go with Canvas.

#### C. Accreditation/Sourbeer

From the state, the college presidents have voted to move forward with the transition from ACCJC. There will be two groups. One will look at ways to improve how ACCJC is functioning and to improve communication during the transition. The other is looking at the transition itself. Locally, Palomar is in good shape for its first recommendation. For the second, Dan was able to get some feedback about Shared Governance from the Classified Staff at Classified Staff Development Day. Reponses about the staff's participation were across the board. It can be difficult to keep such a large group engaged in Shared Governance. While there is still work to do, the response to recommendation two is shaping up well. Our report must be ready to go to ACCJC by October 1.

## D. Articulation/Mudgett

Ben has been working with departments to get courses C-ID approved and to submit ADTs. ADTs in Fil, Television and Mass Media are not required but may generate some interest. Ben is doing some fact-finding to discover if Social Justice and Global Studies Areas of Emphasis are right for Palomar. The General Education approvals for CSU And IGETC have been received. The C-ID approval for statistics is approaching. There will be a thirty day vetting period. The Discipline Input Group will be discussing if an alternate pathway is okay.

## E. Basic Skills/Sivert

There are MATH, ESL and English Jams for Summer Bridge. English is full, Math is almost full. Shayla explained that Summer Bridge is a program of three to four week intense student work after which the student may retake their assessment tests and possible move to the next level. The First Year Experience connects a groups of students to each other as well as college services. This teaches students to utilize all resources available to them as well as establishes a cohort for them to support one another. Both programs are housed in the TLC and are now taking applications.

- D. General Education (GE) Kevin, Craig, Marty, Jenny, Richard and Cheryl met to continue the GE discussion. Richard presented the following numbers: there are 387 unique GE courses which are a part of the Associate, CSU, IGETC or UC patterns. Review results are as follows: 209 were reviewed 3 years ago; 25 were reviewed 4 years ago; 87 were reviewed 5 years ago; 54 were reviewed 6 years ago; 12 were reviewed 7 or more years ago. Approximately 53 need attention to make them current. For the next steps, the group determined that the numbers are a good place to start. Courses will be looked at and any patterns for those courses not touched determined. The group would also like to look at when these courses have last been offered. There was discussion surrounding how we communicate our GE to students, looking at packaging/pathways/communities of courses, how other colleges package their GE and whether GE Institutional Learning Outcomes should be assessed separately.
