VII. **DISCUSSION**

A. Distance Education

1. Workgroup Update/Senate Discussion

Cuaron – Palomar's Distance Education Substantive Change report was accepted by the commission. Our Distance Education Workgroup will spend time this year developing guidelines and procedures for DE as well as correcting gaps in our process. Meetings will start later this month. The Senate has assigned members but others are still encouraged to participate. Those interested should submit their names to the Senate.

B. Prerequisite Enforcement

Cuaron-Electronic enforcement of Requisites is coming next fall. The Student Equity Plan requires a uniform process that ensures equity to all students. Departments should carefully consider the impacts electronic enforcement might bring including impacts to FTES. Research and Planning has data which may be used when considering the use of prerequisites. Departments must propose a curriculum change in Curricunet to change prerequisites to recommended preparation or remove them. Electronic enforcement currently only occurs in English, Math and some of the Sciences.

C. Requisite Challenge Process

Cuaron/Versaci-Title 5 requires a challenge process be in place for students who feel they have met a prerequisite. Palomar's Challenge form is the mechanism by which this process happens.

Discussion occurred regarding the approval of cross-disciplinary prerequisites and whether both departments should have a part in approving a challenge. The general consensus was that the cross disciplinary department would not have the responsibility of determining whether the student would be successful in the target course. There are a small number of cross-disciplinary prerequisites in our inventory. The Challenge Process and subsequent assessment processes address the needs of students and departments. Each department has its own way of assessing student readiness and if needed, may refer as appropriate.

D. Curriculum Committee Goals

The approved 2013-2014 Curriculum Committee goals were presented. Some have been accomplished and there was discussion about including Distance Education, Prerequisites, and a General Education philosophy. There was also discussion about the status of the computer proficiency/information competency goal. Members were encouraged to bring ideas for new goals to the next meeting.

E. Prerequisite Subcommittee Membership - This subcommittee is still in need of more members.

Academic Tech Committee: Evaluating digital literacy skills assessment instruments so we can make a recommendation.

We have licensed enhancements to Blackboard that will increase our functionality and automate faculty and staff input across all of our courses; the new Core module that will include the Community feature will be operational in 2015. The new enhancement will further improve communication between the students and the college and improve access on mobile devices. Faculty, staff, and our many campus groups will be able to distribute news and course content quickly and efficiently. In order to plan for the new features in Core, the campus needs to go to a uniform logon, which will be our 9-digit ID.

Dr. Manea is leading a Streaming Server Workgroup to license a service that will distribute videos to faculty and students in online and face-to-face courses. The workgroup is seeking to establish a procedure that complies with copyright laws, protects intellectual property, and complies with Section 508. Since there are many issues beyond the simple selection of a new product, he has included a cross-section of the campus with Dean Kahn's participation in the discussions. At UNM-V Dr. Manea designed a classroom capture system that digitized lectures that could be quickly archived and streamed; with the new streaming server we could extend easily replicate the classroom capture and make our courses available on a variety of computers and smart devices.

ATRC and ATC members are working with Dr. Kahn and a workgroup to revamp our Palomar College site to make it more functional, easier to navigate, and improve user experience.

A. Student Learning Outcomes in the College Catalog

The accreditation standard which requires program SLOs in the catalog and an example from another college was presented. Currently there is a link which sends students to the SLO page. Program SLOs need to be a component of the catalog itself. Many colleges are abandoning a printed document but we haven't moved in that direction. The inclusion of the PSLOs will not significantly increase the page count or the cost. Initial inclusion will not be an issue after formatting is decided upon. The work will come with maintaining them. Receiving PSLOs by curriculum deadlines would be optimal for the catalog production timeline. The committee agreed that since this is a requirement, we should move forward. The process to collect PSLOs may be fine-tuned as needed. Any reporting required of the SLO Facilitators would need to be discussed since this is not currently part of their role. The committee agreed that this is a largely technical process. B. Academic Technology/Payn

A Teaching with Technology Showcase workshop was delivered on February 19. Submissions are being received until April 1. The Telescope, Palomar's student newspaper, did an article on the Best of the Best showcase in its February 23 edition. Blackboard has agreed to donate gift cards and prizes for this year's faculty Best of the Best showcase winners.

ATRC, under the leadership of Dean Kahn, is conducting a major renovation of the campus website with branding and consistency being major goals. Final decisions are being made, so look for the "big reveal" soon. There will be an update to the campus site and then recommendations from the various departments and faculty that would work with the site. The focus has been on the best user experience for new and current students, as well as others who are looking for information on the website. Focus Group meetings will be held as well as a tour and feedback page to collect reactions to the redesign.

Eighty-one certificates have been awarded to date since launching POET in Spring 2012 with thirteen awarded Fall 2014 and one awarded this Spring, 2015. Blackboard activity: Total Enrollments: 69,469; Courses Available: 1,410; Total Courses: 2,550; Total Courses available to instructors in system: 6,322 (includes previous semesters); Adoption Rate: 55.3%; Average Course Enrollment: 27.2; Page views: 3,223,945.

C. Accreditation/Cuaron

The team has been meeting with a number of groups and people across the college. Questions include why we don't require training for teaching distance education, how well SLOs are integrated into program review, our budget deficit and enrollment slide, enrollment management, outreach, how well these three pieces are connected and how aware of these issues the college is as a whole. Other concerns include lack of tutoring for distance education students and a more extensive array of services, including tutoring, to support students at Camp Pendleton. They have full access to TracDat and Blackboard as is required for this process. There have been good interactions with the team. These conversations assist them in validating that we meet the standards and eligibility requirements as an institution and verify the evidence we have included in our self-study. There have been classroom visits and a really good visit to the Escondido Center. The team was impressed with our commitment and the services offered there. Marty showed them the sandbox area in TracDat and answered questions. They were more

concerned with processes and transition of information from TracDat to PRPs and whether TracDat facilitated conversations. We expect recommendations around the areas mentioned. The exit report will take place tomorrow at 2:00 pm in MD-157. We will receive a draft for fact correction in 30 days, the report will then go to the commission and we'll receive notice of action from ACCJC the latter part of June.
