They stated that the rubric for Written Communication is not yet finished. In early spring semester, a group will be formed to work further on this rubric. Student Success Task Force

Recommendations: Greg Larson reported that on December 3 Vice President Gonzales brought forward to

the Strategic Planning Council a request to create a task force to begin work on the Student Success and Support Program (formerly Matriculation). The Matriculation Plan

is due in October so work will begin early in the spring semester.

TERB Revision

of Forms: This item will be discussed in the spring semester.

Accreditation: Greg Larson stated that second drafts are due this week.

Policies & Procedures: Greg Larson indicated that members of the Policies & Procedures Task Force met last

week. Senate members have expressed some concern with AP 2410, Authority & Administrative Procedures, due to the addition of much more wording resulting in a

narrower scope. It was tabled due to those concerns and discussion will continue.

Members of the task force also discussed AP 5530, Students Rights & Grievances. A work group has been formed under Vice President Gonzales to discuss revisions to the chart which shows the process for both first-level and second-level resolution of various

grievances, as well as the role students will play in the resolution process.

The group also completed a first reading of the Faculty Hiring Policy, which is being presented with minor revisions. The wording written into the policy that states the final hiring determination will be made by the Superintendent/President will remain, but language is included that states input is sought from all committee members in an attempt

to reach consensus.

The policy on Recruitment & Hiring will be brought back early next semester.

Barb Kelber noted that another plan is being added to those which the college must submit to the state. There are EOPS plans, for instance, and others. The Student Success Plan is also being created, which requires a formula for Performance-Based Funding. The Senate's concerns were shared with members of the Policies & Procedures Task Force regarding the direction of Performance-Based Funding. Board member Nancy Chadwick has also shared efforts to lobby against it, and has recommended that everyone review a

study by the University of Alabama about Performance-Based Funding.

Strategic Planning Council:

Greg Larson reported that members of the Strategic Planning Council are currently

discussing the Strategic Plan Priority Funding (SPPF) which will be allocated next year.

Governing Board: Greg Larson indicated that some members of the Governing Board are discussing the

Legislative Agenda for the upcoming CCLC conference.

President Deegan: Greg Larson stated that he and Jackie Martin met with President Deegan for their bi-

monthly meeting on December 4. Discussion centered on the Student Success Task Force

recommendations, particularly as it relates to section offerings.
