CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by the President, Greg Larson, at 2:00 p.m. in Room SU-30.

Approval of Minutes:

Motion 1 MSC Laughlin, Lienhart: Faculty Senate approval of the minutes of December 1, 2014, as amended. The motion carried.

Public Comments: There were no public comments.

Announcements: After some discussion, there was agreement that the Senate should meet on Monday, December 15 to discuss a possible transition plan due to the upcoming retirement of not only the Superintendent/President, but also two deans, and presumed retirements of two Vice Presidents, the Articulation Officer, Evaluations office staff, Academic Department Assistants, and other key staff. Recommendations made by the Senate will then be presented to the Governing Board.

One Senator noted that she recently applied for a full-time position and encountered several challenges during the online application process. She asked the Senate to revisit the issue in the fall semester.

Agenda Changes: Greg Larson indicated that changes may be made to the order of Agenda items due to guests being present.

**Faculty Senate Support
for Emergency
Disaster Training:**

Chief of Police Mark DiMaggio and Supervisor of Environmental Health Derrick Johnson shared the district's plans for disaster training. Johnson indicated that in November a consultant was hired to assist in the process of creating emergency plans for the main campus and the Escondido campus. Those plans will be presented to the Governing Board in February. He added that in 2014 several opportunities were made available for Emergency Response Training, including National Incident Management

System Training, and CPR/First Aid/AED training at several Professional Development workshops.

Faculty and staff are encouraged to familiarize themselves with the college's emergency procedures (refer to the multi-colored flip charts in classrooms), as well as to visit the Facilities website for more detailed information:

Those on campus should be prepared to deal with minor incidents that may occur in classrooms, and know where evacuation sites are and the safest routes to safety. Faculty are also encouraged to educate students and/or employees about the emergency procedures and evacuation procedures for the specific building or area that they are in.

Chief DiMaggio also encouraged everyone to watch the Run, Hide, Fight video on YouTube: www.youtube.com/watch?v=5VcSwejU2D0.

A lengthy question and answer period followed, and DiMaggio and Johnson shared information on how the district is taking steps to make improvements campus-wide, including the installation of several blue emergency phones in several areas, and initiating the process to install locks on every classroom door. Kelly Falcone indicated that she is currently looking into the training being held at the break-out sessions of plenary, and faculty will be notified when all of the information is available.

Senators expressed support for the bulk of plenary to be used for training, and also requested better and more efficient dissemination of emergency information, not just optional PD trainings.

Motion 2 MSC Andre, Laughlin: The Faculty Senate supports the use of the Fall Faculty Plenary Sessions for Emergency Disaster Training for full and part-time faculty members. The motion carried.

Motion 3 MSC Ferro, Albistegui-Dubois: The Faculty Senate supports the district implementing regularly scheduled emergency drills added to the college's academic calendar. The motion carried.

Splitting Committee
Positions Between
Two People:

At last week's Senate meeting, there was discussion on whether committee positions could or should be split between two faculty members. Senate members discussed the potential benefits, such as more committee vacancies being filled when duties can be shared, as well as the potential challenges, such as logistical concerns involving service points and voting rights. There was agreement that service points could be split, or shared, and only one vote would be allowed per position. It was also noted that committee meetings are open meetings, so there is no limit on the number of individuals who can speak on an issue. After some discussion, Senators agreed that the Faculty Senate will consider requests for shared committee appointments on a case-by-case basis to maintain sufficient faculty representation. It would be appropriate, for example, when committee membership structures require faculty appointments from a specific department, or area, to allow or provide that two-faculty representation rather than appointing an at-large faculty member to fill that position.

Justification: Responding to emerging technology, this course will use drones, which include small platforms that operate in uncontrolled Class G airspace, up to 1,200 feet above ground level. Such courses are becoming more common at colleges and universities because drone usage touches many professional areas at a fraction of the costs previously incurred. Drones are now being used to monitor crops, wildlife, forest fires, traffic, as well as surveying and mapping, infrastructure inspection, remote-area delivery of medicine, aerial news and sports photography, TV and movie production, and more.
