The election resulted in a tie which was not reported in the minutes. The minutes of January 27, 2014, will be amended with the addition of wording under "Committee Appointments" to reflect the tie vote.

Marty Furch distributed the following handout on Department Chair SLOAC Responsibilities, which reflects discussion by the members of the Learning Outcomes Council about contract language regarding SLOs and department chair/designee responsibilities:

Department Chair SLOAC Responsibilities 2012/2013 Contract language:

12.9 Student Learning Outcomes and Assessment: The Chair or designee is responsible for leading and coordinating the department's Student Learning Outcome and Assessment (SLO) process. The Chair or designee shall perform the following duties each fall and spring semester:

 Participates in SLOAC/POD (TracDat) (Palomar Outcomes Data Base) training as requested by the SLOAC Coordinator

The SLO Coordinators provide guidelines and training for the department chair or their designee to ensure they are adequately trained in reporting SLOs.

- Provides department and/or one-on-one SLOAC/POD (TracDat) training to faculty each semester Provides training to faculty as needed.
- Coordinates the development and assessment of SLOs for all disciplines in the department.
   Works with department members and coordinates development, assessment, and action plans of SLOs.
- d. Coordinates and ensures that the department's SLOAC data is inputted and current each semester in POD *Provide a summary report to SLO Coordinators and LOC.*
- e. Ensures that the department meets the semester and annual goals and timelines established by the Learning Outcomes Council (LOC).

Meets deadlines according to LOC/SLOAC timeline. Provides a report to deans summarizing current assessment activities.

Discussion followed, and some Senate members questioned the possible overlap of submitting a summary report to both the SLO Coordinators and the LOC in item d, then providing another report in item e.

Furch responded that the LOC recommended a report to the dean because deans work with Curriculum more now than in the past.

One Senator noted that the SLO process is driven by faculty, and deans are already provided with a summary of SLO progress in PRPs. Reports are also being provided to the SLO Coordinators and the LOC.

The issues raised by Senate members will be brought back to the LOC, and this handout can be brought back for further discussion if necessary.

Faculty Hiring
Process (Minimum
Qualifications Issues):

Shawna Cohen explained the procedure that Human Resources will now be using when it screens applications for full-time faculty positions. She noted that in instances when applications are complete but the applicants do not appear to meet minimum qualifications, Human Resources will contact the applicants and invite them to submit the Equivalency form. If they complete the Equivalency form, their applications will be

forwarded to the Hiring Committee. If the Hiring Committee wants to interview one of these applicants, the next step will be for the Equivalency Committee to review the application to ensure that the candidate meets minimum qualifications. Cohen clarified the process and time frame in selecting applicants for interviews, noting the need for a Hiring Committee to provide sufficient time to the Equivalency Committee to review applications as necessary.

A brief question and answer period followed.

# Electronic Cigarette Policy:

The district's current No Smoking policy was created to protect faculty, staff, and students from the effects of second-hand smoke. Currently there is no policy/procedure in place regarding the use of Electronic Cigarettes.

Senate members discussed the ongoing challenges in enforcing the current No Smoking policy, but noted that the difficulty of enforcement does not negate the need for a policy on the use of Electronic Cigarettes. Some students have even reported the use of Electronic Cigarettes by faculty in the classroom.

This item will be brought back for Faculty Senate Action on February 24.

# Village Mentoring Program:

Lawrence Lawson reported that under the STEM II Workgroup, efforts are underway to market the Village Mentoring Program, a campus-wide mentoring program in which faculty, staff, administrators, and students will work as mentors with First Year Experience (FYE) students. The goal is to officially launch the program by fall 2014 with approximately 40 mentors in place working with incoming FYE students. The Workgroup is creating a training manual, drawing on some of the successful programs used in the past, as well as programs used by local colleges in the area. The Village Mentoring Program will be housed under the Teaching and Learning Center and overseen by the Faculty Resource Coordinator.

More information on the program will be distributed in late April. Faculty interested in participating can also contact Lawson.

#### 3SP Task Force:

Greg Larson indicated that members of the Student Success and Support Program (3SP) Task Force have begun meeting. The following workgroups were formed at their first meeting and notifications will be distributed for volunteers:

- Outreach/Marketing: discussions will center around strategies to integrate existing efforts into a
  more collaborative and strategic campus-wide approach

Senators briefly discussed the increasing demands on faculty time, noting that participation in such groups, while critical, is always in addition to faculty's primary role as teachers. This is a tremendous responsibility added on to what is already expected of faculty.

Accreditation:

Marty Furch stated that she attended the Statewide Academic Senate's Accreditation Institute on February 7 & 8. The ACCJC is working on new standards which will likely go into effect immediately. More updates on this issue will be forthcoming.

Policies & Procedures:

Greg Larson indicated that Kendyl Magnuson shared copies of the policy on Enrollment Priorities at the recent Policies & Procedures Task Force meeting. It is a re-framing of the district's current policy and contains updates required by Ed Code relating to foster youth and the armed forces. Copies of the documents with the proposed changes will be forwarded to Senators for review and discussion at the February 24 Senate meeting, and Magnuson will be invited to attend to answer questions.

Barb Kelber added that AP 7120, Recruitment & Hiring, will be forwarded on to the Strategic Planning Council. As discussed at last week's Senate meeting, the role of the observer and compliance officer at the first and second level continues to be clarified. The Vice President of Human Resources, the Vice President of Finance & Administrative Services, the Faculty Senate, and the PFF will work out an agreement relating to coappointing or jointly making recommendations for hires.

One Senator asked that the Senate work to protect the role of the compliance officer at all levels and for all positions. Palomar should make every effort to maintain its high standards relating to hiring which provide protection to both our applicants and committee members.

Greg Larson added that the policy on Faculty Service Areas will also be distributed to Senators for review.

ASG:

Genesis Gilroy reported that the ASG has an item on its next agenda proposing the creation of a resolution regarding the ACCJC/CCSF issue.
