Accreditation Exit

Report:

Berta Cuaron provided a report from the recent visit of the Accreditation Team. Copies of commendations, recommendations from the 2003 site visit, and recommendations from the 2009 site visit, were provided, and lengthy discussion occurred. Cuaron indicated that Palomar will likely be asked to provide a preliminary report in October, 2009, and the Accreditation team would likely revisit and give a follow-up report in approximately 1 year.

All faculty and staff are encouraged to attend the All-College Forum, "Accreditation – Our Next Steps to Reaffirmation," on Tuesday, March 31 at 2:30 p.m. in room P-32. This is an opportunity to hear more about the accreditation site visit, receive information about the exit report, and gain insight into the necessary steps to respond to the recommendations.

Marty Furch added that a suggestion has also been made to hold an all-faculty Forum on Student Learning Outcomes, where faculty can come together to openly discuss their ideas and have their questions answered.

TERB: MaryAnn Drinan stated that the Tenure & Evaluations Review Board (TERB) Working

Group has been revising the current Standards of Performance for Teaching Faculty. Members of the working group include TERB members, Senators, and PFF members. She distributed copies of the draft and noted the proposed changes, and she also provided copies of the current Standards. Drinan noted that updates to the document have not been

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made in over 20 years, and the updates being made now aim to improve the evaluation process.

A question and answer period followed and some minor changes were proposed, including the addition of verbiage related to Student Learning Outcomes and assessment.

Senators were asked to submit additional suggestions to Drinan prior to next Monday's TERB meeting. This item will be brought back for further discussion and/or action at next week's meeting.

Turning to another TERB related matter, Monika Brannick reiterated a discussion held at the March 9, Senate meeting on the current TERB Coordinator's term ending in fall 2009, simultaneous with the upcoming maternity leave of TERB's Academic Department Assistant. Specifically, Brannick wanted to revisit a suggestion made at the March 9 meeting, that because the bulk of the workload for TERB seems to occur in the fall semester, it may benefit new coordinators to begin their assignments during spring semesters to allow them to acclimate to the position under less demanding circumstances.

Drinan was asked for opinion on this proposal, and she stated that although the spring workload is relatively lighter, issues relating to ongoing part-time evaluations, which require significant time and attention, occur in the spring. She stated that she would consider the proposal carefully, and provide an opinion to the Senate soon.

MSC Morrow, Gowen: Faculty Senate ratification of the Curriculum Committee meeting items dated March 18, 2009. The motion carried.

Several members of the Nursing department were present to provide information and answer questions about the proposal to approve the Associate of Sciences, Nursing (ASN) Degree.

C. APPROVAL OF ASSOCIATE OF SCIENCE DEGREE FOR NURSING

Move approval of the Associate of Sciences, Nursing (ASN) Degree. With the understanding that the Curriculum Committee approves the ASN degree only because of the exceptional and emergency situation that threatens the Nursing Program's accreditation. The creation of this Palomar College ASN degree that does not include the American History and Institutions requirement sets no precedent for any other degree and is only an extraordinary measure taken to preserve the Nursing Program's national accreditation.

The Curriculum Committee reaffirms its enduring commitment to the American History and Institutions requirement as a fundamental component of the Associates Degree offered by Palomar College. The Curriculum Committee approves the ASN Degree based on its understanding that the Associate of Arts, Nursing Degree, inclusive of the American History and Institutions requirement, will remain the primary and preferred degree offered by the Nursing Program.

The Curriculum Committee requests that the Faculty Senate and the Governing Board make similar statements reconfirming their commitment to the American History and Institutions requirement.

EHPS Department Minority Statement Regarding the Proposed A.S. Degree

For decades the study of American history and government has been a requirement for all degrees granted by Palomar College. Some faculty members believe that, without exception, this should continue to be the case.

We request, therefore, that the proposed A.S. Degree in Nursing continue such a tradition. Failure to incorporate the study of United Stares history and government represents a radical departure from college tradition and from the values of the community we serve.

As the proposed degree was drafted, senior department members were not made aware of this omission through the appropriate administrative channels. In the last few weeks, some faculty offered more than one way to include the study of American history and government, but none of these possibilities were pursued. Discussions to incorporate some standard of American history and government can still take place before the proposed degree goes before the Governing Board for public discussion.
