Committee

Elections:

Appointments: There were no committee appointments.

Patrick O'Brien announced that a call to fill a part-time faculty vacancy on the Faculty Senate has been distributed. Nominations will be accepted until Monday, October 7.

Stand-Alone Course Training:

Senators were provided with copies of the PowerPoint presentation and a <u>supporting document</u> for <u>Local Approval of Credit Stand-Alone Courses</u>. Rocco Versaci indicated that there are several credit courses that are not attached to any program or major, which are considered, "Stand-Alone Courses." These are currently approved at the local level, then sent on to the Chancellor's Office for approval. In order to maintain our certification to approve these courses locally, faculty need to be trained on the process. He asked

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Senate members to review the documents and contact him with any questions. He also noted that the local approval process is set to end in January, 2014, though an extension could be offered.

Resolution Regarding ACCJC:

Teresa Laughlin distributed draft copies of a proposed resolution regarding the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) and its relationship with many of California's community colleges. She also included several supporting documents that provided data on the commission as well as articles from several sources regarding actions taken by the ACCJC. She asked Senators to review the documents for further discussion at next week's meeting.

Governance Councils:

Greg Larson indicated that there are currently two faculty vacancies on the Strategic Planning Council. Meeting dates are the first and third Tuesday from 2:00 – 4:00 p.m. Faculty interested in serving should contact Committee on Committees Chair Patrick O'Brien (pobrien@palomar.edu).

Larson also noted that faculty is also needed to serve on the Student Services Planning Council and the Human Resources Planning Council.
