II. MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 20, 2006

Pat Hahn requested that his name be added to the list of members present. MSC Cater, Estes to approve the minutes of September 20, 2006 as amended.

III. ANNOUNCEMENTS

Ms. Brannick introduced new member, Kathy Grove, representing the Social and Behavioral Sciences Division. She also announced that Thomas Sbrega will be the student representative on the Curriculum Committee.

Ms. Brannick announced a Curricunet Users group meeting on Friday, October 27 at San Diego City College. Berta Cuaron, Pat Roberts and Diane Veach will attend. Ms. Brannick encouraged members of the committee to consider attending, as well.

Ms. Brannick reported that she was notified of a proposed new course that was cross-listed with a course of another department and that, prior to launching the course, there was no discussion between the departments. She expressed her concern that, when curriculum is developed, there may not be adequate discussion among departments, as in this case, or among department members in general.

In the case of a cross-listed course, Curricunet gives department chairs and division deans only the option to indicate that they have reviewed the proposal. She suggested a change to the approval process to give department chairs and division deans the opportunity to approve or disapprove the proposal. There was general consensus, and this change will be made to the approval process.

New Instructional Program Approval Process

Ms. Brannick reported that the Faculty Senate approved the New Program Approval Process. Mr. Brent Gowen, Faculty Senate President, has taken the new process to the Strategic Planning Council.

In order to emphasize the necessity of adequate discussion among faculty members, the Curriculum Committee proposes additional text to indicate that the faculty member consults with the department in conjunction with writing the proposal. The Committee also recommends the title of this process be changed to Process for New Instructional Program Approval.

VI. REPORTS

A. Curriculum Planning Subcommittee

Ms. Lillian Payn reported that additional members on this subcommittee would be helpful. She has been acting as interim Chair, but prefers that a full subcommittee be formed and then select a Chair. Currently the members are Lillian Payn, Carla Thomson, Sara Thompson, and John Valdez. They typically meet immediately following Curriculum Committee meetings when there are items for the subcommittee's action. Ms. Brannick invited Curriculum Committee members to volunteer to serve on this subcommittee.

B. Information Competency

Ms. Jackie Martin-Klement reported that the group continues to move forward with its research. There are still many questions about assessing basic computer proficiency skills of all students, although there are models available. They are also discussing a more advance assessment instrument, covering research and library skills, for students completing the AA degree or transferring.

C. Learning Outcomes

Ms. Deborah Paes de Barros reported that the Learning Outcomes Council continues to identify information to report to WASC about how we assess learning outcomes. Council members are gathering information directly from departments via personal visits, discussions, and written information. Eventually, the Council will have enough information to prepare a report.

There has been a lot of effort in the Basic Skills area, including discussion of a Basic Skills Center. They are also looking into an Honors program, which would require faculty support in order to be successful.

VII. FUTURE ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

Ms. Brannick reiterated her concern that faculty members work together on overlapping curriculum matters.

Ms. Gloria Kerkhoff stated that she noticed in the college catalog that prerequisites on some courses include a statement that a course prerequisite must be completed with a "C" or better. Most prerequisites do not include the "C" or better statement. Ms. Kerkhoff suggests that the prerequisites should be presented in a consistent fashion in the catalog.

There is a paragraph in the catalog that states clearly that in order to meet a prerequisite, students must earn a "C" or better in the class.

Ms. Cuaron reported that recent legislation will give districts authority soon to approve courses that are not part of a certificate or degree. Currently, such stand-alone courses

require approval by the CCC System Office. The scrutiny will change in conjunction with the local approval authorization.
