Ms. Drinan discussed the department's recommendation that notes be included in the catalog and class schedule alerting students that they may not enroll in POSC 120 if they have previously taken POSC 102 and vice versa. MSC Hohman, Eckhart to approve the fields for Academic and Vocational Program Review and to further approve a 2 year cycle timeline for Vocational programs. A timeline for Academic Program Review will be brought back to the committee after soliciting feedback from departments.

A Basic Skills action plan has been submitted. The group is meeting with architects to design the Teaching and Learning center at Escondido. Mr. Sosa reports that there is a lot of progress being made also by way of Teach and Learning Communities and Professional Development workshops.
