

Stained Glass Materials Requirements

Welcome Stained Glass Students,

Your instructor, Brian Canfield, is very excited about teaching his stained glass techniques and art to our group of students. We want this to be a truly wonderful experience for everyone and thought it would be helpful to give you an idea of what you will be purchasing, or may want to bring with you to class. For the first day, everyone should bring a pair of **safety goggles**. The rest of the materials can be purchased after the first day once they are gone over in class.

The initial investment for stained glass is like any art medium. To help those of you who would find the costs challenging, we are providing the use of several soldering irons and several glass grinders in the classroom. These are available to all students, but must be shared in a considerate manner. If you can, we recommend that you bring your own soldering iron and/or glass grinder to reduce the wait time for everyone. Most importantly, students must buy or have the appropriate tools outlined in the class syllabus for each class. Brian will be bringing limited types of smaller tools as well as soldering strips, glass and stained glass chemicals with him for students that have trouble purchasing supplies, but do not rely on him as the primary source for materials. Brian's business is not a retail shop; but, he will help enrolled students in the name of education. Remember, once you have most of the basic items, you will only need to purchase glass and a few consumable supplies for future projects or future classes you take. Below, are at least two places where you can purchase supplies in the San Diego area. You can also search online and order your supplies over the internet for perhaps lower cost. You may wish to wait until after the first class to purchase supplies, once you have talked with Brian. Naturally, if you already own these items, please bring them along! The \$100 - \$200 materials fee may include your purchase of a soldering iron, pliers, glass cutter, solder, glass, etc... The cost will be less if you already own some stained glass tools. Keep in mind that the glass art supplies cost **changes with the economy**. Prices may be more or less than what is quoted in the syllabus. **HAVE A GREAT CLASS!!!**
