Items 13.b, 14.b, and 15.b: Per the College's annual review of institutional set standards in working with the Academic Senate, the institution has adjusted Palomar's institutional set standards for degrees, certificates, and transfers.

Item 18: Traditionally, the College has listed the RDA national licensure examination pass rates. However, the national exam is expensive and very few (less than ten) Palomar College students annually sit for it. We attempted to insert "N<10" as our response for item 18. However, the report data entry system converts that to "0%," which is ultimately an incorrect value.

Item 19: The 2014 job placement rate for paramedics appears as 0% because the data source was based on less than ten students in the cohort. The correct job placement rate for 2014 is "N<10." The system converts "N<10" to "0%."
