ISER 2022 - What is it?

Palomar College is accredited by The Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC). Every seven years, the College is required to conducted a self assessment and analysis and submit an Institutional Self Evaluation Report (ISER) to ACCJC. The ISER provides evidence regarding how Palomar meets accreditation standards and identifies our plans to improve institutional effectiveness. This is our opportunity tell Palomar's story and to show how we provide access to education and critical resources to improve the lives of our students.

The Accreditation Steering Committee has identified a theme for the two year project: Exploring a Legacy of Excellence and Charting Our Future. Modeled after an archeological expedition, we will begin this semester with an excavation. We will "sift" through all of the programs and services and take note of what we do to meet the standards. In Spring 2020, we will begin our field journal by documenting all of our findings and connecting our "artifacts" to evidence that shows how we meet the standards. In Fall 2020, the we will illustrate our practice of "preservation, restoration, and innovation" of Palomar programs and services through the telling of our story. In Spring 2021, we will publish our findings in the completed ISER. It will then go through a review by our governance structure for endorsement of the report and in Spring 2022, we will hold our "featured exhibit," the peer review site visit. In Summer 2022, ACCJC will take action on our ISER and inform us of our status on reaffirmation of accreditation.

Our 10 writing teams, representative of all constituency groups of Palomar College, have already kicked off our expedition. They are looking at the standards, reflecting on our practices, and collecting evidence. Our story is best told by our subject matter experts so we may be calling on you to answer questions and provide additional evidence that will ensure the authenticity of our story. With 80+ writing team members, and your contributions, we will illustrate Palomar's commitment to providing quality education and support services that facilitate student success. We will also chart our way forward by identifying intentional strategies for improvement.


Learn the Standards and Win!
