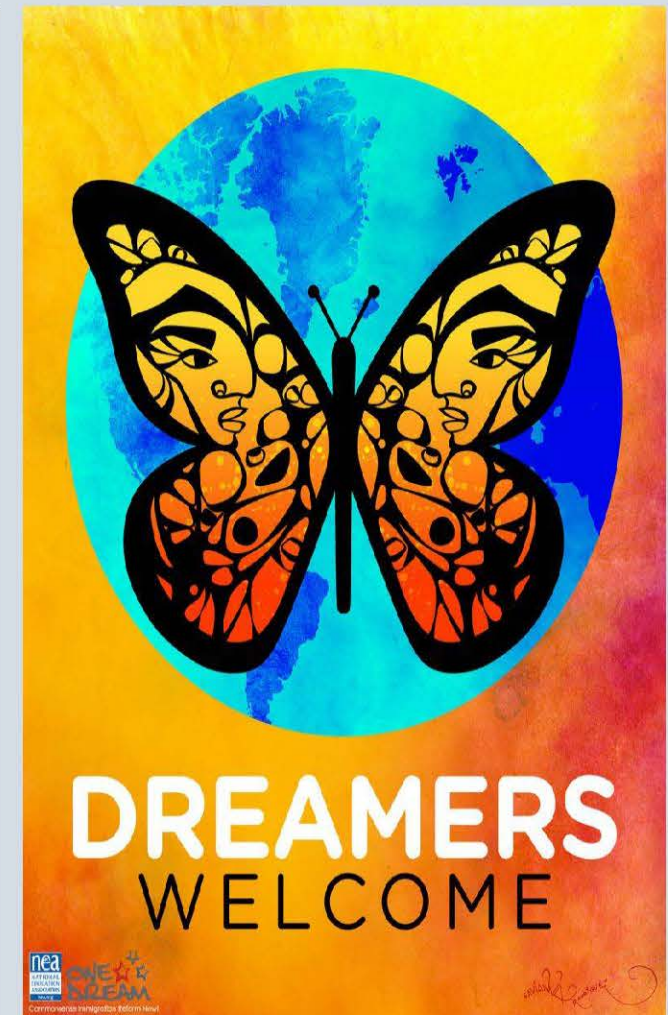

We understand that attending college can be costly; financial aid is available through the California Dream Act Application, Palomar College scholarships and outside scholarships.

FINANCIAL AID APPLICATION INFORMATION

Undocumented, Deferred Action Childhood Arrivals, or U Visa holders should fill out a California Dream Act Application if **AB540 or AB2000** requirements (find requirements below) are met. To fill out a California Dream Act Application, please visit <https://dream.csac.ca.gov/>

Students must also file a **AB540/AB2000 Affidavit** with admissions; scan the QRCode below to find the form:



AB 540 Requirements

Attendance at a California high school(s) for 3 years or more graduation from a California high school or High School Equivalency Certificate issued by the California State GED office or Certificate of Proficiency, resulting from the California High School Proficiency Examination.

AB 2000 Requirements *

Attained credits earned in California from a California high school equivalent to three or more years of full-time high school coursework and attended a combination of elementary, middle & or high school in California for a total of 3 or more years and graduation from a California high school or attainment of High School Equivalency Certificate issued by the California State GED office or Certificate of Proficiency, resulting from the California High School Proficiency Examination

***Please note: Students who are non-immigrants, other than those with a T or a U visa (for example, those that hold F visas, B (visitor) visas) – are not eligible for the AB 540 or AB 2000 exemptions.**
