

CSU NORTHRIDGE 2020-21 Lower Division Curricular Changes

MAJORS:

ATHLETIC TRAINING, BS. - **Removed** from ASSIST. Last cohort for the B.S. in Athletic Training was accepted in Spring 2020. As of Fall 2021 changed to a Master's degree program. Undergraduate applications no longer accepted.

BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION, B.S. – New options * effective as of **FALL 2021** application cycle:
