- 2) Summer Bridge and FYE Gabe
 - i) Gabe attended the Palomar Promise (PP) Coordinating meeting in November
 - (1) All PP students will be FYE students starting this fall
 - (2) Tuition & Textbook assistance up to \$1,000
 - (3) Priority registration
 - (4) Graduates from 2017, and attended eligible public high school in district
 - (5) One transaction: apply to PP/FYE: student success agreement tag to FY student group
 - (6) Parallel piece in Financial aid, Promise funds processed like a scholarship award
 - (7) New financial aid director
 - (8) FYE size will grow, conservative 1,000 students (currently under 200)
 - (9) Paradigm shift, all incoming freshmen will be FYE students. We will provide all of the services dedicated to student success
 - (10) Application delayed, to Feb 22
 - (11) EOPS/TRIO meeting has already taken place
 - (a) How to better collaborate, to minimize duplication of services

FYE orientation needs to be re-vamped (conference style) to maintain integrity but this model may not be manageable at large scale, and needs to be restructured.

- 3) Learning Communities and Mentoring Lori
 - i) Lori working on final touches: LCs offered Fall 2017
 - ii) PUENTE: Student Success Program (English 50 level in Fall, Counseling class)
 - (1) Emphasis on Latino Literature, spring ENG 100, same Instructor & Counselor, mentoring is a piece of the program too.
 - (2) Cultural enrichment component
 - (3) 3 phases
 - (a) will begin in Fall 2017, Letty Aguirre PUENTE Counselor
 - (b) Chicano Studies 102 Spring
 - (c) Mentoring: Letty collecting names from faculty and community professionals
 - iii) Mentoring: Lori and Letty joining forces.
 - (1) Fall 2017: link one LC TBD
 - (2) Joint mentor/mentee mixer 1st 2 weeks of Fall term

4) TLC - Debra

- i) TLC SM skillshops: ongoing
- ii) 17 scheduled, few pending
- iii) Collaborating with TRIO/DRC/EOPS: recruiting table @ TLC
- iv) PRIDE center contacted us to present workshop
- v) Scholarship application workshop happening right now, full
- vi) Fall 2016, the TLC offered 21 workshops/ 311 student participant with an 82% rate of show rate.
- vii) special events: Lunar New Year Celebration
- viii) Currently planning: Night @ Planetarium/Howard Brubeck Theater production
- ix) TLC ESC:
 - (1) For Fall 2016, 85% show rate
 - (2) tutoring offered
- 5) Continued discussion on blending committees
 - i) BSI/SSEC/SSSP: blending of committees may not happen too soon
 - Gabe and Lori presented our concerns, we are an operational committee, concern about representation, roles of council vs committee, overlap of members—seen as workgroup, no push to combine us.
- 6) Adult Basic Education Block Grant (AEBG)- Barbara Blanchard
 - i) Adult Ed Block grant: not a grant, line item
 - ii) Classes that fall into it: all non-credit, not degree applicable, non-transferable: documentation requested to quantify what we are doing to assist our students: Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)
 - iii) Documentation requested
 - iv) Applied for federal grant: basic skills, English learners....estimated \$500,000 direct service to students
 - v) Submitting to consortium for our group, anticipating to get it
 - (1) Will bring that to this group to see how we can use this money to help students
 - (2) Pre-post tests required in classrooms: Chancellor's office align reporting requirements with federal reporting requirements (already created by CASAS we will work to see which tests will be used for which classes)
 - (3) All agencies have to feed data to CASAS: REQUIREMENT (vendor hired to collect data)
 - (4) Suzanne purchased tools for this and BSI in addition, CASAS Conference to learn about options
 - (5) Currently exploring how to make this work for the students and see how we can make this work, support to make this happen
 - (6) AEBG funding: want to get ideas from courses, programs where we can use AEBG funding: please submit ideas for NEW things to start up
 - (7) All decisions have to be made through consortium, personnel hired across sites to serve @ consortia level
 - (a) Hire transitions coordinator: bridge gaps to next stage
 - (b) Career specialist/career counselor: full time bilingual to help with all AEBG programs (interim adjuncts now) get Ed plans for non-credit students
 - (8) Curriculum alignment projects, find gaps and fill gaps
 - (9) Supplies/materials: ESL, education to career network *name of our consortia
 - (10) Surveys conducted: at 50+ communities
 - (11) Operational: outreach, site licenses, travel for institute CASAS attendance: June 13-June 15th Orange County
 - (12) Summer Bridge is eligible to use this funding

- (13) Surface Pros for INEA, lots of equipment, operational expenses
- (14) Try to spend out by December, inquire now.
 - a. DRC students: furniture? Lori will send info of needs for students to Suzanne
 - b. Microsoft surface pros are supported by our IS dept: get classroom sets?
- (15) 2 funding sources
- (16) new FTES for Palomar
- vi) Thinking about Noncredit:
 - (1) 10 areas (9 areas) that we have to meet to qualify
 - (2) Funding
 - (a) CDCP funding
 - (i) Program and courses within that area, not individual courses
 - (ii) A "Program" is currently defined as 2 or more courses, definitions still pending
 - (iii)Early May Non-Credit summit, first ever
 - (iv)Program and curriculum should be put forth at the same time
 - (v) Title and course description should clearly indicate and identify the noncredit population for which course was created
 - (vi)Barbara sent PPT, ask if needed
 - (vii) Even if not using AEBG funding, Math 10, English 10 will have to use CASAS pre/post tests
 - (viii) Funding changes: moving towards outcomes based
 - (ix)Issues of "accountability" California aligning with Federal Standards
 - (x) Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)
 - (xi)Way to integrate with learning outcomes: how can we have this work for our students, administratively it is a nightmare...
 - (xii) Add as reporting item out in the future
 - (xiii) Innovative ideas to improve programs at PC, cannot supplant, must be NEW!
