This Associate in Arts in Psychology for Transfer degree offers students the opportunity to meet lower division transfer requirements for a major in Psychology, leading to a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science in Psychology at a California State University (CSU). Students who earn this degree will receive priority admissions at a CSU. The Associate in Arts in Psychology for Transfer degree is the first step in preparing students for professions and areas of interest related to psychology such as Clinical Psychology, Counseling, Medicine, Law, Management, Business, Social Work, and Teaching. The requirements for an Associate in Arts in Psychology for transfer are: (1) Completion of 60 semester units or 90 quarter units that are eligible for transfer to the CSU, including both of the following: (A) The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the CSU General Education-Breadth Requirements. (B) Minimum of 18 semester units or 27 quarter units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community college district. (2) Obtainment of a minimum grade point average of 2.0.
