Certificate of Achievement or A.A. Degree

The program will give students general knowledge and skills in theory, principles, and techniques for working in an administrative position.

The 47 units listed in this section enable students to complete an Early Childhood Administration Certificate.

Students also have the option to earn an Associate in Arts Degree in Child Development by completing 47 units for this Certificate and the General Education courses required by the college.

CHDV 200 should be taken in the last semester for this certificate or A.A. degree major program.

- Individual employers may have varying academic requirements for employment.
- The Child Development Department strongly recommends students complete CHDV 100 during the fall or spring semester.
- CHDV 121 is highly recommended for all Child Development students.
- CHDV 195 is required for the Child Development Permit issued by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing for Master Teacher, Site Supervisor, and Program Director permits.
- This certificate is separate from the Child Development permits issued by the state of CA. Please see one of the full time CHDV faculty for more information about the Child Development permits.
