- 1.) Introductions- One goal is to continue to expand the committee this year to include additional center directors within our district. The CHDV department wants to connect with our community in as many ways as possible. The advisory committee is a perfect way to include as many community members and share what we are doing with each other.
- 2.) We briefly discussed past implementation of the CDTC at Palomar. Student Eligibility and Payment Policies were discussed. All policies will continue as the previous years. Fall Participant Profile information was shared including the 409.5 units that were submitted. Discussion occurred on how to increase student participation for the spring semester. In addition, the Student Evaluation Composite from the fall semester was distributed to the members. Discussion followed. All past students will be emailed Profile information for future semesters.
- 3.) New permit information- Lengthy discussion took place on the new permit requirements. Diane and Jenny shared the latest information. Jenny serves as a representative CCCECE and had some additional information. Information was also shared in regards to the temporary (hopefully) closing and limited hours of the San Diego County Office of Education San Marcos site.
- 4.) Budget update- Consortium and Mentor- Discussion took place that there were not as many students applying for Consortium funds this year. It has been a trend for the last few years. There is also a need for more mentor teachers. Ways to recruit were discussed. Center outreach is needed. Diane has some release time this spring semester to go out to centers and share class schedules, Mentor recruiting information, student advising, Consortium flyers, and new permit information. Discussion continued on site staff meetings and individual advising sessions. Some dates were tentatively set for February and others will follow over the next couple of weeks.
- 5.) Class Offerings- Advising for students is available from our department faculty for the permit and degrees/certificates. There was much discussion on new class opportunities for Palomar to teach as some sites, including MAAC. CHDV 102, 103, 106 130 and 155 were all discussed. Employers would like CLASS, DRDP, ECERS, and ASQ to all be discussed in one class at Palomar. These are needed for QRS. Maybe a Saturday class for the DRDP on how to do observations and scoring/rating the measures. Discussion continued in regards to the QRIS and ECERS-3. MAAC shared information on their need for Community Assessment participants as well as information about human trafficking (someone had just gone to a meeting on this topic) as well as prenatal program/care. Jenny shared information on the CCCECE regional meeting that will be held at Palomar this coming April. Lastly, information was shared on the Palomar North and South Centers and the course offerings at these sites. Further information and flyers will be shared as they become available.



What is a Mentor Teacher?

Mentor Teachers work in high quality programs and provide excellent supervision for Palomar CHDV students taking the practicum and advanced practicum classes. Students work in your class 3+hours a week during the semester to experience how to plan, implement, and evaluate curriculum directly with children.

Mentor Teachers are paid \$250 a year to be part of the program and paid \$250 per student that they mentor. You can also earn other stipends and attend professional development programs all expenses paid!

Are you Qualified?

- > 2 years teaching experience in an ECE setting
- ➤ Work at least 3+ hours a day, 5 days a week with the same group of children.
- Completion of a Degree or Certificate in ECE or CHDV (including at least 1 class in supervised student teaching).
- Eligibility for the Master Teacher level (or higher) Permit.
- Completion of an Adult Supervision/Mentor Teacher course (CHDV 195).
- Submission of an appropriate ECERS or ITERS on your site or classroom.
