New Business:

Hours required for Fieldwork

With the new self-quarantine restrictions, students are struggling to find hours. Liz set up a spreadsheet for Zoom interpreting sessions, specifically focused on educational presentations. Students sign up for a session and interpret live between hearing and Deaf individuals. It has been a somewhat success, but technological challenges are frustrating. Harvard, MOOG, Coursera, have online courses that are open for viewing and interpreting practice.

Exit Exam

Board recommends 78% passing score for exit exam. Can waive hours if pass the exit exam.

Perkins Grant:

Palomar is in a good position to get educational interpreting materials, online curriculum, mentoring, Deaf individuals to interpret for, software, VRI/VRS, develop media for online interactive interpreting for afterschool programs, English tutoring

Lab Classes

Liz and Melissa have been working with the Curriculum Committee to add required lab classes. ASL I and ASL II will have .5 unit lab class as a co-requisite starting in fall 2020. ASL II and ASL IV will start spring 2021. Interpreting I-IV already have lab co-requisites.

Concerns

Advisory Board has concerns about ASL adjunct prioritization hiring that directly affects the interpreting program. The prioritizing policy unintentionally excludes qualified native signers and prioritizes non-native signers.
