The Advisory Roundtable was called to order at 3:34 p.m. by Reza Wrathall.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE AND INTRODUCTIONS

Reza Wrathall shared the purpose of the meeting, which is to bring industry partners, educators, and workforce partnership together to review curriculum and collaborate to update the same based on workforce needs and demands.

1. Brief introduction by Business Department Full-Time Faculty and Part-time Faculty, including any interests and concerns regarding specific courses, programs and disciplines.

Faculty attendees introduced themselves and expressed their interests and concerns.

Interests and Concerns:

- Digital transformation.
- The needs for quantitative literacy.
- The impact of COVID on our students' outcomes and the resulting changes in the educational and workplace environments.
- Career exploration for dual-enrollment high schools.
- Jo Moore expressed her interests in finding grant/funding to support students to be certified in medical coding (e.g., though Strong Workforce or PERKINS funding).
- The possibility of creating an Advisory Board dedicated to the supply chain management program at Palomar College.
- Keeping curriculum updated and helping students for success.
- Grant opportunities to invigorate the Entrepreneurship program.
- Integrating the Business Club, Accounting Club, and Law Club at Palomar College, to include labs and student-driven initiatives.
- 2. Introduction by Advisory Partners, including any interests or concerns in your practice areas and/or in response to Faculty introductions.

Advisor attendees introduced themselves and expressed their interests and concerns.

Interests and Concerns:

- Internal mechanism at Palomar College to receive grant/funding.
- Responding to and prioritizing the needs of the North County (e.g., 78 corridor) community.
- Building and leveraging the pathways between local Adult Schools and Palomar College (e.g., inviting Adult School students to the Business-Accounting-Law Club at Palomar; and having Club members present to the Adult School).
- Identifying and then meeting the requirements for Adult School students to transfer to Palomar College.
- Articulating classes for Adult School students according to Palomar Pathways.
- Keeping curriculum updated based on the Advisory Board's recommendations.
- Curriculum in Supply Chain Management.
- How to help students navigate the job market.

OPEN DISCUSSION AND DEVELOPMENT OF QUARTERLY/SEMI-ANNUAL ACTION ITEMS

After introducing themselves and their respective interests and concerns, attendees moved into open discussion to identify areas for action or follow-up.

1. Reinvigorating a combined Business/Accounting/Law Club

Al Taccone shared that MiraCosta's club has a wide-ranging agenda (e.g., internships and guest speakers). Food is always an incentive while meeting face-to-face; otherwise, offering extra credit by attending club events can also encourage student participation.

2. Medical Coding Program

Jo Moore expressed her interest in developing a medical coding program. Attendees suggested that she first obtain labor market demand and trend data with which to support a grant request. Resources: Mesa College and Education to Career Network for North San Diego County (ETCN) for program information.

Jackie Martin will set up a separate meeting with Jo Moore to discuss further.

3. New Technology - Blockchain and Al

Attendees discussed how blockchain and Artificial Intelligence (AI) technology are driving market change. Several attendees suggested these topics be incorporated as part of a speaker series (both guest and student presentations) for the reinvigorated Business/Accounting/Law Club. Attendees also suggested co-teaching or integrating this content with CSIS Department, underscoring the close connection between Business and IT.

4. Enrollment and the Growth of New Programs with Alternative Funding

Jackie Martin reported that the enrollment in Palomar's business programs has increased by at least 18% during the last year while the college in general has experienced a material decrease in enrollment. Further expansion of the Business Department to meet this increase demand is limited by financial caps imposed at the college level. For this reason, a new (non-credit) Project Management program has been created without the use of general funds. Increasingly, the Business Department is looking to more creative ways to meet growing demand for our offerings.

Attendees discussed the process of college allocations and how to most effectively provide recommendations to steer the same to meet the increased demand in Business Department offerings.

5. Sponsorships?

Considering the current restrictions on meeting increased demand through general funds, attendees discussed the possibility of pursuing sponsorships for the Business Department. Individual and corporate sponsorships could be marked by a hallway placards or insignia at Business Department and/or Business Club events.

6. Suggestions for the Next Advisory Roundtable

Attendees suggested and discussed the following:

- Invite more industry partners.
- Solicit and listen to industry input on skill sets in demand, especially in North County.
 Jennifer Patel explained that there is already a concerted push to convene entrepreneurship faculty at a regional level.
- Hold the next meeting at a place in of industry in or around the City of San Marcos.
- Consider hosting/organizing a Chamber-of-Commerce style speaker event, perhaps for breakfast (7:30am start), centered on a keynote speaker from industry.
 - For example, invite Tina Ngo Bartel from the Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research for Labor Market presentation.
- Invite industry partners who can provide internships to our students.
- Invite combined Business/Accounting/Law Club members to attend.
- Partner with the CSIT Department to combine resources.
