#### VIII. DISCUSSION

#### A. Technical Review Process

Wendy led a discussion on our review process and steps that may be developed to improve the college's CORs. Upon looking at our current process, we do have a model that works. The group discussed ways that the process could be improved upon. Discussion included having technical review meetings where key players such as faculty originators, department chairs, SLO facilitators, articulation officer, deans and others meet face-to-face and offer feedback on proposed curriculum. Discussion also included getting a technical writer who would look more closely as curriculum. The committee ultimately wants a process which strengthens and supports well integrated CORs.

## B. Non-Credit Transcript

We currently do not have a noncredit transcript at Palomar but it is something we could do. There are a fairly small number of community colleges which have implemented noncredit transcripts. They are recorded in PeopleSoft but there is no way to communicate it to the student. There is a grading symbol for noncredit courses called "Satisfactory Progress." When Palomar moves to a noncredit transcript, the grading symbol would have to be integrated into classes. There would be no grade so offering certificates could be a problem. As courses continue to be developed into a sequence of noncredit courses leading to an outcome, CDCP (Career Development and College Prep) could enhance funding. In these cases, we would need to develop a transcript process. There are still questions surrounding setup and programming in PeopleSoft and MIS reporting. Once these questions are finalized, more progress may be made. Discussion continued regarding student needs, the potential for changes to policies and procedures and other ideas to move this forward.

#### C. TOP Code Alignment

This project looks at consistently and correctly applying coding, especially SAM, in order to enhance the

college's funding. A pilot has been held with two departments and plans are being made to look at courses college-wide.

## A. Academic Technology/Payn

To date, there have been 24 earned POET certificates this year. There are a total of 164 certificates since POET started in 2012. A little more than 50% of courses are in Canvas. One-on-one training sessions are always available through Academic Technology.

#### C. Articulation/Mudgett

Development of a Chemistry ADT is being explored at Palomar. To date, Palomar has 202 courses which have been C-ID approved. Palomar is in the early stages of developing articulation with Cal State San Marcos in the areas of Engineering. There will be a NCHEA meeting where discussion of development of transfer degrees in historically difficult areas such as Chemistry, Physics, Computer Science and Biological Science will take place.
