٧. **DISCUSSION**

A. Curriculum Training

The Palomar College Curriculum Institute is being postponed until the Spring semester as there are too many scheduling conflicts for the fall semester. Other training ideas were discussed including developing videos, drop-in labs and workshops. Training surrounding integration of SLOs was also discussed as well as trainings for individual COR elements. The committee discussed syllabus development as well as the different needs of specific faculty groups, e.g. probationary faculty. It was also suggested that curriculum training be offered during fall plenary with a representative from the Statewide Academic Senate presenting.

B. Governance Structure

Discussion surrounded the addition of Suzanne Sebring, Director of Occupational and Noncredit Programs, and Nichol Roe, Associate Dean, Workforce Development, to the Curriculum Committee membership. Adding the two as voting members was also a part of the discussion.

Suzanne's work involves interaction with faculty for the development of curriculum. Recently, she worked with Sarah DeSimone to develop noncredit courses which prepare students for Emergency Medical Education. She has also worked with Photography to assist with the development of their noncredit courses. As Director, she oversees the instructional training of over 4,000 credit course students.

Nichols's role as Associate Dean would make her a beneficial addition to the Curriculum Committee. The scope of her work is broader than Suzanne's, but is still important to the credit course conversation. Nichol is very involved with the "Extended Education" piece of the CTEE (Career, Technical, Extended Education) Division as well as noncredit.

When presented with the idea of adding these two as voting roles, the Faculty Senate expressed concern over whether adding two more administrative roles could potentially "Swing" the vote. Since curriculum falls under the purview of faculty, there were mixed views about whether adding two more administrative votes is appropriate. Based upon the ratio of faculty to administrators, the Curriculum Committee had no problem with the additions but after further discussion decided that forwarding a recommendation to add the Associate Dean as a voting member would be appropriate.

E. Communicating Curriculum Information to Divisions

How information is communicated to the campus from the Curriculum Committee is extremely important. The committee discussed strategies for information sharing as well as examples of what some areas are already doing. This topic has become more important than ever since extra scrutiny is required as a part of the new local certification process. Ben shared that he gives a curriculum report as a part of weekly Counseling meetings as well as Division meetings. He also pointed out that all Counselors and Adjunct Counselors receive the agendas. The committee admitted that division representation is not always complete as some divisions have open positions. A suggestion to use a tool like Cornerstone (Palomar's new PD system) in order to communicate with specific groups in a blog or discussion board type setting was offered. While some members agreed with the idea that a technology resource is good, it may not be effective for all. More discussion will follow.

F. 2017-2018 Curriculum Goals

Goals from the previous year were discussed and the status was updated. Additional items outside of those which have yet to be accomplished were brought for consideration for this year's goals. Discussed were the Computer Proficiency/Information Competency, General Education, Distance Learning and accessibility, requisite approval, University Studies degrees and noncredit. Recommended additions were Guided Pathways, course deactivations, the Annual Credit Course Certification and Learning Outcomes Council as a subcommittee of the Curriculum Committee. Further discussion will continue at the October 4 meeting.

Canvas has an "Observer" setting that fits TERB requirements (and complies with FERPA): no access to grades, student information, or communication to students, which is suitable for the Evaluators.

(Note that while the ATRC staff can set up the access within Canvas itself, the SIS sheet where the personnel formally gains the permission is an Instruction Office responsibility, and then PeopleSoft staff actually assign the NI/Observer staff within the corresponding Canvas course. ATRC is coordinating with the Instruction Office and PeopleSoft staff.)
