#### V. **DISCUSSION**

# A. Cultural Audit Review Document/Nelson

Wendy engaged a discussion about the Cultural Audit document. She presented an example obtained at the ASCCC Winter Institute from another college. She discussed using this document as a part of a pilot spring review campaign. There was discussion about what kind information could be gleaned from the audit. The audit could be applied to the elements of the Course Outline of Record. Luis expressed the Math Department's interest in the audit. Wendy suggested a Winter Intercession project and Luis agreed. Patricia suggested finalizing the worksheet by have an interactive discussion in order to obtain the necessary data to inform faculty. John M. suggested the need for a subcommittee to concentrate on furthering the work. Many suggested assessing and updating the document to more appropriately capture needed data. Those interested in participating include John McMurria, Luis Guerrero, Patricia Menchaca, Vickie Mellos and Patti Dixon.

# VI. INFORMATION

#### A. Ethnic Studies/Mudgett

The California State University System has made changes to the core competencies to Ethnic Studies based upon feedback they received. The Statewide Academic Senate passed a resolution to change Title 5 regarding Ethnic Studies. They are now awaiting the policy on how to carry this out. Palomar is working with AIS, AS, and CS in order to be able to submit our courses by the February 5, 2021 deadline. This will ensure our readiness to offer them in fall 2021. There is concern from some four-year faculty, mostly within AIS and Asian Studies areas, with having the area F courses only available as lower division (at community colleges).

#### B. Cross-Listed Courses/Nelson

Drop-ins will be offered to help faculty update minimum qualifications December 8 and December 14. Wendy presented the lengthy list and asked that faculty consider de-cross-listing courses which have different minimum qualifications. If we are able to integrate this work into the review process, we may be able to continue it into the spring semester. De-cross listing cannot be done as a review. A course change will need to be proposed to accomplish this.

# C. CVC OEI Consortium/Hiro

Erin Hiro presented the Student-Centered CVC Exchange. It lists all of the courses in the system available for online. The state wants all California Community College schools to become "Home Colleges." If a student selects a course outside of their district, the course shows up in their Palomar cart to register. There has been discussion in Faculty Senate about Palomar become a "Teaching College." This allows Palomar to have its classes in the Exchange so that after Palomar students register, the courses would be open for other students to register. This could improve our class numbers for traditionally low-enrolled courses. The Exchange makes it much quicker and easier for students to get the courses they need. Home college status is automatic, Teaching College status is something we must decide upon. Transcripts will be integrated so that there will not be a need for students to evaluate from college-to-college. As long as Palomar students register when they are supposed to, they will have access to courses. After a certain deadline, registration will be opened to outside students. Palomar students will have first priority but must register in time.
