CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by the president, Monika Brannick, at 2:00 p.m., in Room SU-30.

Approval of Minutes:

Motion 1 MSC Chau, Gowen: Faculty Senate approval of the minutes of October 5, 2009, as amended. The motion carried.

Public Comments: Shannon Lienhart stated that the Palomar Faculty Federation (PFF) is advocating for positions on two of the planning councils: the Instructional Planning Council (IPC), and the Student Services Planning Council (SSPC). PFF currently has named positions on the Human Resources Planning Council and the Finance & Administrative Services Planning Council. She added that the Faculty Senate, CAST, and CCE/AFT have named positions on all of the planning councils, and in the process of collegial decision-making the PFF would like to have representation as well. Lienhart referred to wording in the contract that states..."the Federation shall designate the faculty representative(s) to serve on any committee or council that may be established in the district that relates to matters within the scope of bargaining. The Federation shall have the right to representation on district committees and councils that are responsible for subjects that may impact the collective bargaining relationship between the parties. The Federation shall have the sole responsibility for appointing PFF/AFT representatives to such committees and councils."

Lienhart distributed copies of a document based on her review of the Instructional Planning Council minutes. She cited several discussions related to union issues that have occurred at IPC meetings.

One Senator noted that it may be appropriate for the Senate to recommend that one of the faculty appointed positions on the councils be a member of the PFF rather than a delegated and named position on the councils. It is important not to undermine the authority or responsibility of the Faculty Senate, or the culture of participatory governance. AB1725 refers to the various constituencies that participate in the shared governance concept, namely the Faculty Senate, the classified union, CAST, and students.

It was also pointed out that the various councils should stay within the purview of their responsibilities. If the IPC is engaging in discussion of matters such as working conditions and staffing, PFF representation is required.

Discussion followed, and Senators who have served on IPC acknowledged that discussion in those meetings often moves into what might be considered negotiable matters. They also noted the need for more faculty representation, in general, on IPC.

Lienhart emphasized the PFF's intention to go forward to the Strategic Planning Council with the request for seats on both the IPC and the SSPC. The PFF hopes for the Senate's support. Monika Brannick stated that she would place this item on the Senate agenda for further discussion and/or action at next week's meeting.

Announcements: Monika Brannick announced that she and Bruce Bishop attended the recent meeting of the Facilities Review Committee to propose the idea of providing informational kiosks on campus. Although the idea was generally supported, discussion will now focus on specific design issues.

Bruce Bishop offered some background about the current procedure relating to the distribution and posting of literature on campus, and he suggested that the policy and procedure should be updated.

Monika Brannick announced that she attended a "National Coming Out Day" celebration in the Student Union area earlier in the day, sponsored by the Palomar College Gay Straight Alliance. She added that the group currently has 67 members.

Motion 2 MSC Laughlin, Gowen: To suspend the agenda to discuss Information item G, "Mission 2 Be Clean and Green @ Palomar." The motion carried.

Mission 2 Be Clean and Green @ Palomar: Claudia Duran reported that Phi Theta Kappa is sponsoring a "Mission 2 Be Clean and Green @ Palomar" on Saturday, October 24, and Sunday, October 25. Faculty, staff, and students are invited to attend the campus clean-up event. Lunch, snacks, and water will be provided. She added that an electronics recycling event will be held on Sunday, October 25 from 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. in Lot 1. They will collect any and all electronics, batteries, etc. Information will be distributed campus-wide over the next two weeks.

Policies &
 Procedures:

Gowen pointed out that addressing the fourth recommendation of the Accrediting Commission will require the college to develop (1) a policy on “due process” that assures the rights of evaluatees during performance evaluations and (2) a policy and procedure on the evaluation of senior administrators that specifies the role of faculty. Human Resources will have a draft of the due process policy in November. Drafting the policy and procedure on the evaluation of senior administrators, a joint project of the Senate and HR, may take longer.

Discussion followed regarding the purpose of the evaluations of administrators and the role of public commentary. One Senator noted that the evaluations of senior administrators have historically been of no consequence, and it will be difficult to resolve the question of what the faculty role in a new process should be.

Senate members were asked to review BP & AP 4232, Pass/No Pass Grading Option, for discussion and/or action at next week’s meeting.

Other:

Monika Brannick noted that no Faculty Senate agenda Reports have been heard yet this semester due to the time needed to discuss other items on the agenda. She asked Senators who have committee or group reports to determine whether their reports require the quick attention of the Senate. If so, they should write a brief report and forward it to the Secretary. Those reports will be included in the minutes.

Kathleen Sheahan reported that the Academic Technology Committee met last week. The group will add a work group entitled, Student Preparedness, to those groups whose progress was discussed at last week’s Senate meeting. The committee will also look at
