- Public Comments:** Senators welcomed incoming Curriculum Committee Co-chair Greg Larson. Although not an official Senate member yet, Larson will attend the meetings as he prepares for his transition into the position.
- Announcements:** Senate members congratulated Patrick O'Brien on the recent birth of his daughter on February 18, 2011.
- Barb Kelber announced that members of the Tenure & Evaluations Review Board (TERB) will begin a conversation about evaluation protocols that might apply in a case now being proposed in which two faculty members hope to share a lateral transfer, establishing a 50/50 joint appointment in two departments. Although the matter will be discussed in TERB (per Article 17 of the faculty contract) the proposal for a 50/50 shared lateral transfer will necessarily be brought to the Senate as an Academic and Professional matter, as well as to the Palomar Faculty Federation for questions related to the contract. Kelber indicated that this item would be on the Senate agenda for discussion at next week's meeting, and she will report to both the Senate and the PFF if the work in TERB progresses.
- Wendy Nelson announced that Palomar College's Communications department has invited media experts from around the country to discuss the future of the industry during a series of talks March 8-9. Media Days will include speakers from different communications fields including newspapers, online journalism, cinema, multimedia, photography, and television. The event runs from 9:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on March 8, and from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on March 9. All of the talks will be held in Palomar's Governing Board room. All are free and open to the public.

MSC O’Brien, Towfiq: Faculty Senate ratification of LS 240, Legal Studies, with the Multicultural designation removed. The motion carried.

ASG:

Associated Student Government (ASG) President Channing Shattuck shared with the Senate the ASG’s Planned Policy Change regarding Palomar’s current policy on smoking on campus:

There shall be no smoking permitted anywhere on the campus boundaries or parking lots of Palomar College. Any questions or concerns related to this policy or enforcement should be directed to the Director of Student Affairs.

Shattuck expressed the ASG’s hope that the Senate would discuss the policy and offer feedback. The ASG would like to build consensus around the goal of a “smoke-free/tobacco free” campus, and they hope for a statement of support from the Senate. Senators discussed the proposed policy, and there was some concern expressed about enforcement, particularly because the current policies are not enforced and cannot be overseen by Campus Police. Because there is no enforcement mechanism in California law with regard to smoking, students in violation of the policy would have to be approached and informed of Palomar’s policies by the Director of Student Affairs. There was also concern about including the parking lots in the policy, as it doesn’t indicate whether students could smoke in their cars. There was also a suggestion that the ASG obtain information from the other constituent groups on campus, as they would also be affected by changes in policy.

One Senate member suggested that the policy be limited to students only, rather than include faculty and staff. Because students spend fewer hours a day on campus, and for a shorter length of time – a semester, or a year or two – the impact on them is less than on those who are employed here for many years and who are here for 8 or 9 hours per day.

Additional discussion followed on the issue, and although there was skepticism about how such a policy could be enforced, there was overall agreement that uncertainty about enforcement shouldn't deter the ASG in their efforts to move toward their expressed goal – a healthier environment for all.

Motion 8 MSC Laughlin, Klement: The Faculty Senate supports the ASG's efforts to restrict smoking by Palomar College students. The motion carried.

The Senate President asked that the minutes reflect that the vote was not unanimous.

Policies & Procedures: The next meeting of the Policies & Procedures Task Force is on March 18, 2011.

GRAD Program: Monika Brannick reported that members of the GRAD project (Goals, Responsibility, Attitude, Determination) are still waiting to receive funds from the Strategic Planning Council Grant to begin implementing the plans for the project.

SB1440 Update: Monika Brannick shared the following update from the Statewide Academic Senate on SB1440:

The Academic Senate has created a new discussion board on SB 1440. They have been fielding hundreds of questions on the implementation of the new degrees. In an effort to reduce the workload and be responsive to questions, they have developed a discussion board, which will allow the sharing of questions and answers statewide. The good news: The CSU reported on Tuesday that the first three TMC (Sociology, Psychology and Communication Studies) were sent to all of their campuses and they were asked 1) if a student arrives with a TMC-aligned degree in these majors, could they graduate the student in 60 additional units, and 2) to identify which majors they consider "similar" to each TMC . In this first round of inquiries, 21 CSU campuses responded.

In the case of Sociology, 18 campuses responded that they have majors that would accept a TMC-aligned degree.

In the case of Psychology, 18 campuses responded that they have majors that would accept a TMC-aligned degree.

In the case of Communication Studies, 16 campuses responded that they have majors that would accept a TMC-aligned degree.

Therefore, at the present time, at least 16 CSU campuses have agreed to the first three TMCs. This is excellent progress.

The less than good news: After the first round of inquiries of the CSU campuses, it was reported that San Diego State University did not deem any of the first three TMC as "similar" to their degrees (this was the only campus that took that stance). Although this was discussed at length by the IOC, it did not reach a resolution during the meeting. However, more discussion on this topic will take place between the two segments in the coming weeks. We understand that this issue raises concerns among the colleges that feed into SDSU, and we want to assure you that we are making every effort to work out a solution to this concern.

The two Chancellors will be meeting soon to address several implementation issues, including San Diego's decision about the first three TMCs, and ways to give students with the AA-T or AS-T clear advantages over students who do not have the degree, including admission and registration priority. Given that the majority of CSU campuses have agreed to accept all three of the first TMCs, there is reason to be hopeful that the outstanding implementation issues can be resolved.

Also, we want to share with you that the intersegmental faculty dialogs so far have been very cordial and productive. When CCC and CSU faculty have met to discuss their curriculum, the results have been increased understanding and mutual respect, and a clarified curriculum for our students. On February 25, over ten discipline groups met in San Jose and developed approximately 50 draft C-ID descriptors and six new TMCs for degrees. On March 11, a similar meeting will be held in Irvine where intersegmental discipline faculty will build on the work begun in the north. At the same time, several disciplines are finalizing their TMCs and we hope to be able to send out several newly-finalized TMCs in the next few weeks. When they arrive, we encourage colleges to consider developing new degrees that align with these TMCs.

Learning Outcomes
Council:

At last week's meeting, in a discussion regarding access to the Palomar Outcomes Database (POD), a Senator inquired as to whether the data stored there by departments and faculty members could be the subject of a Public Records Request. Katy French followed up by seeking information from John Tortarolo, who has indicated that the data is indeed accessible with such a request. French indicated that members of the Learning Outcomes council will be discussing this issue at their next meeting on March 31, 2011. The Learning Outcomes council will incorporate this information into the POD Reporting & Access, Policies & Procedures document that they are currently drafting. Upon completion of the document, it will be forwarded to the Senate for review and approval.

ASG:

Marlita Donan reported that the ASG website has been updated. She encouraged all to visit the site.

Members of the ASG held a workshop for new members this past weekend.

Joint Senate/PFF
Council:

The next meeting of the Joint Senate/PFF Council will be held on Tuesday, March 15. The group will be discussing BP 7120, Hiring & Recruitment Policy.

Palomar Faculty
Federation:

Jackie Martin-Klement indicated that the next meeting of the PFF will be held on Wednesday. The group continues discussions on dues restructuring. The most recent issue of "Watchdog" was just distributed, where it was announced that the .98% of COLA funds will be distributed to all faculty.

Governing Board:

The next meeting of the Governing Board will be held on Tuesday, March 8.

Faculty Service
Area Review:

Lori Graham reported that a PFF member is still needed to serve on the Faculty Service Area Review Committee. The group is also looking for a faculty member to represent the Career & Technical Education division.

Strategic
Planning Council:

Barb Kelber indicated that members of the Strategic Planning Council held a Special Meeting on March 1 to participate in the formative evaluation of the Integrated Planning Model (IPM) process and the Resource Allocation Model (RAM) process.

Reports were heard from each of the Planning Councils about how they had used the Integrated Planning and Resource Allocation Models, describing the process and sharing information about funding priorities. Kelber reminded Senators that planning and resource allocation are the key elements of the accreditation commission's

Recommendation 2, and the SPC's formative evaluation is meant to be a kind of a check-in relating to works-in-progress.

Human Resources
Planning Council:

The next meeting of the Human Resources Planning Council will be held on March 15.
