CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by the President, Greg Larson, at 2:00 p.m. in Room SU-

30.

Please note: All votes are presumed unanimous unless indicated otherwise.

Approval of Minutes:

Motion 1 MSC Ritt, Laughlin: Faculty Senate approval of the minutes of February 8, 2016, as

presented. The motion carried.

Public Comment: There were no public comments.

Announcements: Jenny Fererro announced that the district is exploring an instructional partnership with

some schools and universities in Anhui province in China. Early childhood education/child development is being discussed as a first program priority. Fererro, Jack Kahn, and Yasue O'Neill will be visiting the area for a week beginning March 12, 2016.

Travis Ritt announced that Political Economy Days will be held April 13-14, 2016. Speakers are needed for the event and the Foundation has agreed to cover the cost in the \$500 to \$1,000 range. Those interested should contact Ritt or Teresa Laughlin for more

information.

Greg Larson announced that a call to fill upcoming Senate vacancies will be distributed next week. He also reminded Senators that the election for Faculty Senate President will

occur at the April 4, 2016, meeting.

Agenda Changes: Senators agreed to change the order of the Agenda items due to guests being present.

Hiring Processes: At last week's meeting Senators discussed the recent number of interim administrator

positions and how those appointments were made. Board Policy and Ed Code were referenced, which requires that these positions, even those that are interim, be opened for

a full and open recruitment process that utilizes the permanent hiring processes.

Today, there was discussion on the possible need for additional language in AP 7120 to clarify processes specifically related to interim or internal replacements, and the need for the members of the Policies & Procedures Task Force to discuss, review, and amend the policy accordingly.

Mike Popielski shared information on how the process occurred to fill recent dean positions, all of which resulted in failed searches. The positions were then filled by the Governing Board, who made those interim appointments at a board meeting. The Senate has expressed concern with that process, which provided no opportunities for discussion or input from any group on campus.

Adrian Gonzales acknowledged the Senate's concern and indicated that errors in communication were made in hiring for those positions as a result of the need to have them filled prior to the start of the semester. He agreed that AP 7120 has some areas that need to be discussed and updated.

Senate members reiterated their disappointment with administrators being appointed rather than going through the interim hiring process that includes committee discussion and interaction. Also talked about was the need for further dialogue regarding individuals in an appointed interim position being given the opportunity to apply for the permanent position. It was noted that many colleges have policies in place that prevents those in interim positions to apply for the permanent position when it becomes available.

Members of the Policies & Procedures Task Force will discuss this issue at their next meeting.

Part-Time Faculty Hires at the Feb. 9 Board Meeting:

Greg Larson reminded Senators of action taken at the February 9 Governing Board meeting where Trustee John Halcòn indicated concern based on his perception of diversity in new part-time faculty hires. Specifically, he asked that the three English part-time hires be pulled from the consent calendar and considered separately. He confirmed that he was basing this perception of lack of diversity in the candidates solely on their names. The board voted 4-1 in favor of approving the hires of those part-time faculty, with Halcòn casting the dissenting vote.

Adrian Gonzales indicated that although he was not present at that meeting, he has discussed the matter with several individuals, including PFF Co-President Shannon Lienhart, the English department Chair, and Trustee Halcón. Not only is it inappropriate for the Governing Board to single out a particular department in this manner, it is incomprehensible to use an individual's name as a determining factor of whether they are a diverse candidate. Although it may not have been a specific violation of the law, this is not a precedent the district wants to set. If there is a question about adjunct diversity as a whole there is some data available (age, gender, and some indicate ethnicity), but the data would not present a complete picture of the true diversity of our faculty.

Gonzales acknowledged that there are some legitimate concerns about diversity in hiring, and campus discussions need to occur on what diversity means to us and what we value as an institution. Secondly, a review and analysis of the data of faculty, staff, and student diversity is being conducted that will help contribute to the discussions. Thirdly, if it is determined that there is an issue the campus will need to decide how it is addressed. Rather than focusing on numbers it will be beneficial to have discussions on what we

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value around diversity, the broad definitions of diversity beyond ethnicity, and how to accomplish our goals. He added that a board workshop focusing on this issue is currently scheduled for next month. Lengthy discussion followed.

Tutoring Committee Governance Structure Request:

Senate members were provided with a copy of the Governance Structure Group Request for the Tutoring Committee. The committee is proposing the addition of the Tutoring Coordinator or designee to represent Veterans Services. Senators expressed their support of this addition. This item will be brought back for Action at next week's meeting.

Faculty Rationale

Form:

Greg Larson stated that there is a proposed change to the Faculty Rationale Form that allows departments to rank positions in their requests.

Presidential Search Process and Committee Composition:

Greg Larson reported that the Governing Board will be interviewing two search firms for the Presidential search process at a Special Meeting Tuesday, February 23. The final composition of the committee will be determined after the selection of the consultant firm.

Committee Appointments:

Travis Ritt reminded Senators of Goal #4 of the Faculty Senate Goals: Review Faculty Senate Operational Committees to improve efficiency. This was to be completed by February 22, 2016. He indicated that until some of the administrative positions are filled that require input in these discussions, this item will be placed on hold.

Deans:

Academic Technology Committee:

Lillian Payn provided the following written report of the Academic Technology Committee:

ATC Report to SENATE Committee — 22 February 2016

- 1. One meeting a month most of this semester so our Feb meeting will be this week.
- 2. Noteworthy is the progress on the Streaming Server implementation:

Almost 1500 titles in the old server that will be surplused at the end of this Spring semester. About 375 are from PCTV videos that instructors have regularly used.

We have a new procedure to comply with the TEACH Act, which is to archive legally obtained copies of media in the library. The media in the old server will not be transferred because:

- 1. The technology is a different format
- 2. The copies may not be legally obtained
- 3. The library does not have copies of the media for archival purposes
- 4. Many titles are obsolete and not used any more.

Quick outline of the procedure:

- 1. Check the library media data bases to see if the copy is there, already digitized and closed captioned.
- 2. Obtain a legal copy of the media, if not in the data base already.
- 3. Fill out an online form in ATRC site to submit with the media to the library circulation desk. https://www2.palomar.edu/pages/atrc/faculty-services/streaming-media/streaming-media-submission-form/.
- 4. (Note that publisher's content cannot be stored in our server, but the instructors can use routine inclusion of those publisher's materials within BB. Instructors can receive assistance with this process from ATRC tech staff as needed.)

Status

After sending out a couple of announcements, we have about 23 titles already digitized, closed captioned, and stored in the server. The PCTV titles will be transferred by the staff since we own the copyright.

ATRC requests that instructors don't procrastinate, since our staffing will not be able to fulfill a massive number of requests during their office hours at the last minute prior to summer school or the fall semester, since overtime is not allowed. Please let us know how we can assist.
