- C. FON, Accreditation, Global Pandemic: Michelle Barton presented a spreadsheet outlining Palomar's fall 2020 Faculty Obligation Estimates (Exhibit VI). The spreadsheet compares three different FTES calculations based on 1) prior year P2/Hold Harmless, which shows a total growth adjustment of 18, 475 and 2) 2019-20 Credit FTES estimates as of February 20, 2020 without F-Factor which shows a total growth adjustment of 17,271 and 3) 2019-20 Credit FTES estimates as of February 20, 2020 with F-Factor which shows a total growth adjustment of 17,401. These February 20, 2020 estimates indicate that it is unlikely we will reach the 18,475. Next she explained how this affects our FON. When our FTES was more stable, it was easier to predict FON, but over the last few years, it's been much more difficult. Senator Lawrence Lawson commented that the FON was overdone in the last academic year. Barton stated that there is often a difference between what the calculations are and what decisions are made. Although Barton provided calculations prior to the last hiring to PFF, Lawson requested that in the future, those FON calculations be shared with Faculty Senate as well. Senator Teresa Laughlin added that the executive administration team makes the final decision regarding how many faculty are going to be hired. Laughlin also mentioned that there are an additional seven more faculty retirees not in this calculation so we are only five over FON now.
