Lot 15 Adjustment Proposal

The objective of this proposal is to change San Marcos Campus Lot #15 from a student lot to a designated visitor lot. Currently, Lot 15 is an exclusive student lot containing 125 spaces. There are no specific staff spaces in the lot. Our adjustment would convert Lot 15 into a visitor lot to be utilized for special events including theater performances, concerts and other various occasions. Due to the high frequency of events that take place on campus, the College needs a dedicated lot for visitors. For a majority of campus events, Lot 1 and 2 are the lots reserved for parking. However, Lot 1 and 2 are the primary staff lots for the College. During 2018, lot 1 and 2 were requested a total of 212 times. For 60 of those events, Lot 1 and 2 were requested for concurrent events. Even though a parking lot is reserved, there is no guarantee parking spaces will be available due to lots still functioning as staff and/or student lots. Having Lot 15 as a designated visitor lot would alleviate scheduling issues, guarantee spaces for events and provide convenience for entities hosting and attending events.

Furthermore, having Lot 15 as a designated visitor lot would enhance our Department's parking enforcement. As of now, having a mix of visitors and students/staff in a lot hampers our ability to check vehicles for permits. The officer conducting parking enforcement would not be able to check for permit compliance in a mixed lot. If lot 15 was for visitors only, our officers would be able to enforce the other lots regularly. This would ensure that individuals with permits would have more of a warranty to park on the campus and fortify visitor parking in Lot 15.
