Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS) is a state funded program designed to support the enrollment and retention of California residents impacted by economic, social, and educational disadvantages. The program's intent is to address barriers to personal and academic success to allow participants to successfully achieve their educational goals, including vocational certificates, associate degrees, and/or transfer.

EOPS at Palomar College provides a variety of educational and financial support services to eligible students including Counseling (Academic, Personal, Career, and Transfer), Textbook Grants, School Supplies, Priority Registration, One-on-One Tutoring, Student Success Workshops, Four-Year College Application Fee Waivers, and more.

In accordance with Title 5, section 56272, Palomar College EOPS develops an annual plan, submitted to the Chancellor's Office. Additionally, EOPS submits an Annual Budget Plan for approval. The Annual Plan is inclusive of the following components:

- Long-Term Goals aligned to the Chancellor's Office Vision for Success
- Short-Term Objectives and Activities (planned use of allocated funding)
- A narrative year-end report summarizing the accomplishments of the previous academic year including:
  - Program objectives achieved
  - Advisory Committee involvement
  - Outreach efforts
  - Workshops and class offerings
  - Student success
  - Student awards/scholarship acknowledgements
  - Special program success
  - Overall program evaluation
