<p><u>Guided Pathways at Community Colleges: From Theory to Practice</u> This article describes the proposed guided pathways model that involves redesigning each part of the student experience, from the stage where students choose programs and start remedial or college-level work to the time of graduation, when they move on to further education or careers, and reviews current reform efforts taking place at over 250 colleges across the United States</p>		
<p><u>Next Frontier Guided Pathways Research: Studying the Effects of Pathways Reforms</u> CCRC is partnering with the Tennessee Board of Regents and the Washington State Board for Community and Technical Colleges to produce a series of practitioner-oriented research reports and briefs as well as a field guide with associated tools to help practitioners implementing pathways measure the effectiveness and costs of their reforms.</p>		
<p><u>Building Blocks: Laying the Groundwork for Guided Pathways Reform in Ohio</u> This report describes how Ohio’s two-year colleges are approaching guided pathways reforms, focusing on innovations they have implemented in recent years that can serve as building blocks as they seek to transform their policies, practices, and culture following the guided pathways model.</p>

<p><u>Assessing, Supporting, and Scaling Pathways</u> This workshop described how Student Success Centers can use CCRC's Guided Pathways Scale of Adoption Self-Assessment tool to facilitate understanding of the guided pathways model in their states.</p>
