


### **General Information**

### **Programs Offered**

#### **Certificate of Achievement**

A Certificate of Achievement is a 1.5 year - 2.5 year program. Certificates are awarded to those who complete specified course work in a vocational/occupational program. Examples are: Architecture, Advertising, Marketing, Early Childhood Administration, Fashion Design and Merchandising, and Interior Design.

#### **Associate Degree**

The Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree is a 2 - 3 year program. The degree is awarded upon completion of no less than 60 units, including general education, required major courses and electives. Examples include Business Management, Dance, and Drafting Technology.

#### University Transfer Program (2+2)

This 2 – 2.5year program leads to transfer into a four-year university baccalaureate program. Transfer eligibility verification is issued to students who complete no less than 60 transferrable units including general education, required major preparation courses, and any electives.

### So, What is 2 + 2 Transfer program?

Transfer program allows students to transfer to a four-year university in junior standing.


2 years at a community college completing the first and second year of Baccalaureate program

### What is the benefit of "2+2"??

- Flexible application process
  - Open enrollment no need to apply a year in advance
  - Lower English proficiency Requirement
    - A UC campus: iBT/80, PBT/550, IELTS/6.5
    - A CSU campus: iBT/61, IELTS/5.5
  - Palomar College: iBT/47, PBT/470, IELTS/5.
- No SAT required
- Lower Tuition Fees (Annual Estimates)
  - A UC campus: \$40,000 +
  - A CSU campus: \$17,500+
  - Palomar College: \$9,000
- Smaller Class-Size: average of 25 to 40 students per class
- Professors dedicated to teaching, not researching
- No Teacher's Assistants teaching the class
- No Application fee
- Centralized International Center Admission, Academic Counseling, and Housing information


