



A course may be certified in one area only with the exception of Area 6 double counting in 3B. IGETC may not be appropriate for selective majors at the UC. Consult a counselor for details. Students who initially enrolled at a UC campus, and attend a community college are not eligible to use IGETC for the same UC campus.
