In the United States of America, students must complete General Education requirements which include **Written Composition, Math, Science, Humanities**, to name a few to complete academic degrees

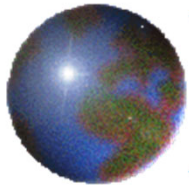

Total Units: Minimum of 60 degree applicable semester units. Courses numbered 1-49 are non-degree applicable and do not count toward the degree.

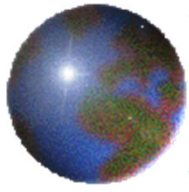


TRANSFER PREPARATION



- University of California and California State University require 60 transfer level units to include:

- general education courses
 - preparation courses in the major
 - Electives
- 60 transferable units equates to Junior status
 - It is important to decide on a major as soon as possible



What are Transfer Level Courses?

Courses numbered
100 and higher

Ex. Math 110

Math 60 is not
transferrable

- Look up in the College Catalog
- MATH 110 College Algebra (4)
- Transfer acceptability: CSU; UC
- This means Math 110 is transferrable to both CSU and UC (both CSU and UC accepts Math 110)

The California State University (CSU) General Education-Breadth pattern is one option that allows California Community College transfer students to fulfill the lower-division general education requirements of any California State University campus. The pattern includes 39 lower-division semester units with a minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA required, which may be certified by California Community Colleges. Partial certification may be granted by Area (A, B, C, D, or E). Full certification may be granted if all areas and units are completed. Courses may only be certified in one area and must be on the list at the time it was completed. Please see a counselor for specific information regarding major preparation.
