

In the United States of America, students must complete General Education requirements which include Written Composition, Math, Science, Humanities, to name a few to complete academic degrees










TRANSFER PREPARATION



- University of California and California State University require 60 transfer level units to include:
 - general education courses
 - preparation courses in the major
 - Electives
- 60 transferable units equates to Junior status
- It is important to decide on a major as soon as * possible * Learning for Success*



What are Transfer Level Courses?

Courses numbered . Look up in the 100 and higher

Ex. Math 110

Math 60 is not transferrable

- Transfer acceptability: CSU; UC
- This means Math 110 is transferrable to both CSU and UC (both CSU and UC accepts Math 110)


